Officer Involved Shootings

What effect does the media have on public perception?

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Experimental Design:

- → Administered an anonymous survey to 500 randomly selected UVU students.
 - Control Group 250 Random Students
 - Surveys were identical to each other other than the treatment applied.
 - Treatment Group 250 Random Students
 - Respondents were asked to watch a short Pro-Police news story.

Hypothesis:

The experimental (or treatment) group will provide responses that are more positive toward police decision making than those of the control group. Additionally, those respondents who are exposed to the video will provide less neutral responses than those of the control group.

Regardless of group assignment, we anticipated respondents of ethnic minority origins would provide more negative responses regarding police action due to the high rate of minority casualties in officer-involved shootings.


Community Cohesion & Police Approval


A 2003 study conducted by USC researchers Maxson, Hennigan, and a Sloan suggested that good community cohesion has an effect on approval of the local police.

Community Cohesion & Police Approval

We asked questions about the respondents' communities and their approval of police before administering the video.

We hypothesized that strong community cohesion would result in a strong approval of police.








Comparing Responses of Control and Experimental Groups


- Responses to questions asked before the video were equally uninfluenced.
- Responses to questions following the video were intentionally designed to present bias in favor of police for the experimental group.
- While responses may have been influenced by a number of factors, we assume that the largest contributing factor to differences in data between the two groups is exposure to the video.


In the last year, how do you feel the number of officer- involved shootings has changed in the United States?







In the last year, how do you feel the number of officer- involved shootings has changed in Utah?







Police officers are too quick to fire their weapons during encounters with civilians.







Police officers should employ other means of force (IE: tasers, batons, etc.) before using lethal force during encounters with hostile persons.







Police officers should employ other means of force (IE: tasers, batons, etc.) instead of lethal force during encounters with hostile persons.







Police officers are more likely to discharge their firearms on racial minorities than other ethnic groups.







Police officers are being held responsible for their actions following officer-involved shootings.







Police agencies' investigations into the justifiability of officer-involved shootings are fair and thorough.







The federal government should investigate officer-involved shootings that seem to violate civil rights.







All police officers should be required by law to wear body cameras.







Use of body cameras by police officers will result in fewer unjustified shootings by police officers.

Conclusions

- Strong neighborhood cohesion does indicate high approval of police conduct.
- Exposure to pro-police media does positively influence public perception of police conduct, particularly concerning officerinvolved shootings.
- With additional data collection, we could benefit from cross-tabulation analysis of other influential factors such as race, geography, and area of academic study.
- We recommend, based on our findings, that agencies build relationships with members of the media and concentrate efforts at educating the public on the realities of police work. We believe that such efforts would improve public perception.
- Data was insufficient to determine trends in responses from ethnic minorities.
