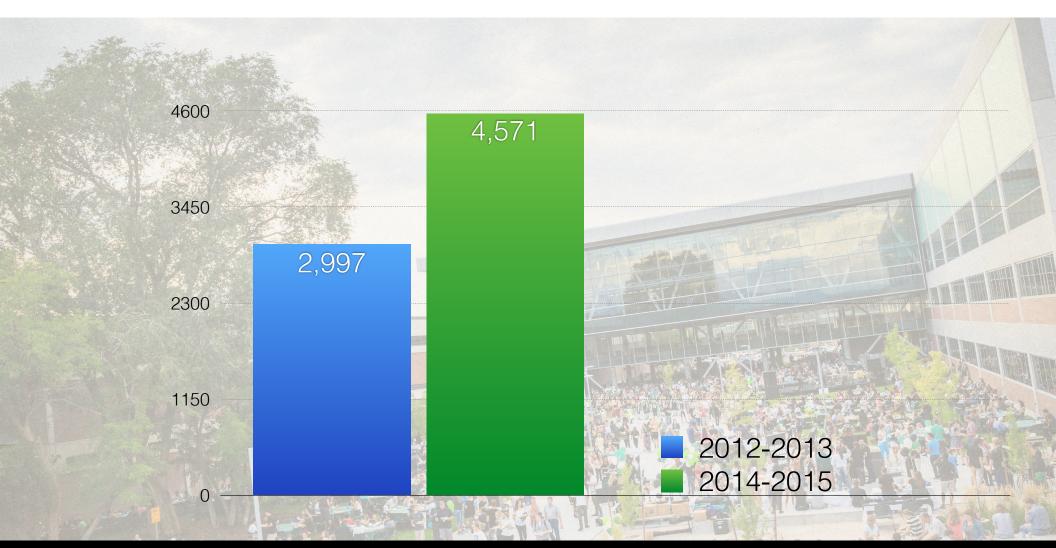

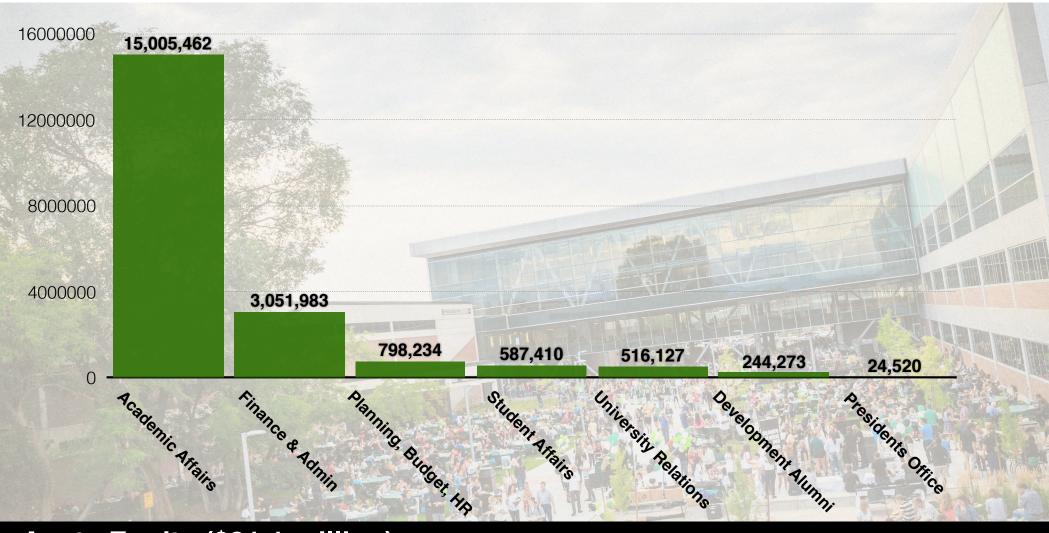

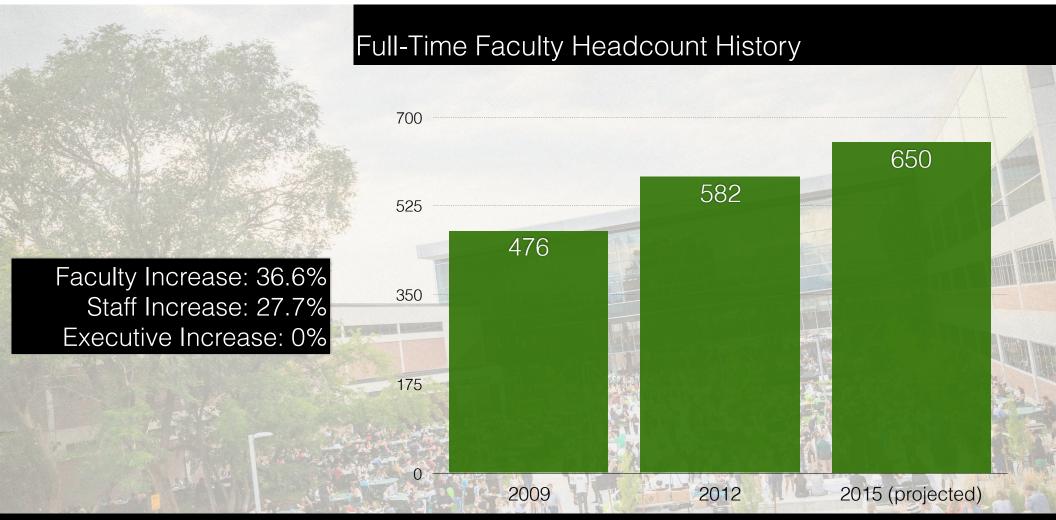
UVU Today Stronger than Ever



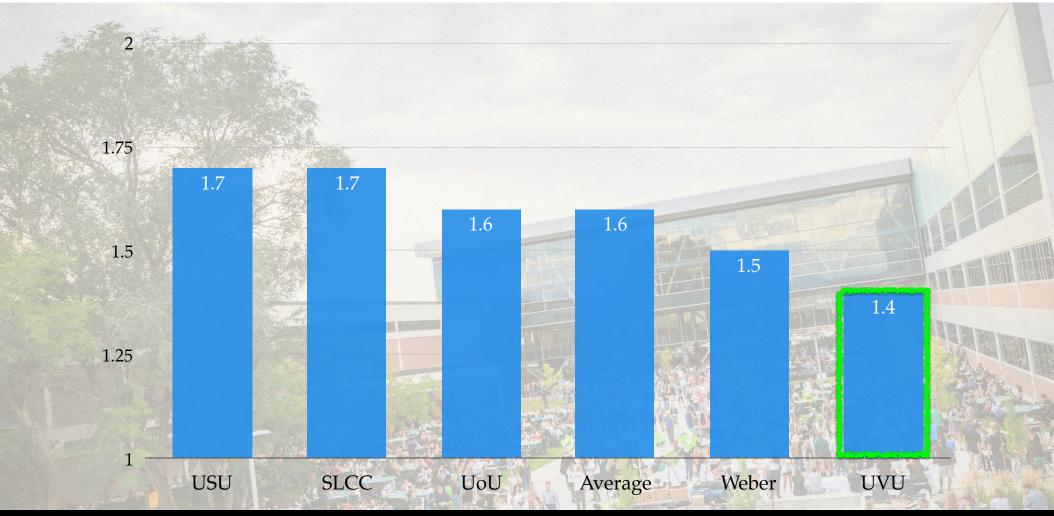
Tax Funds per FTE Student: 12-13 to 14-15 Comparison



Acute Equity (\$21.1 million) Allocation by Division

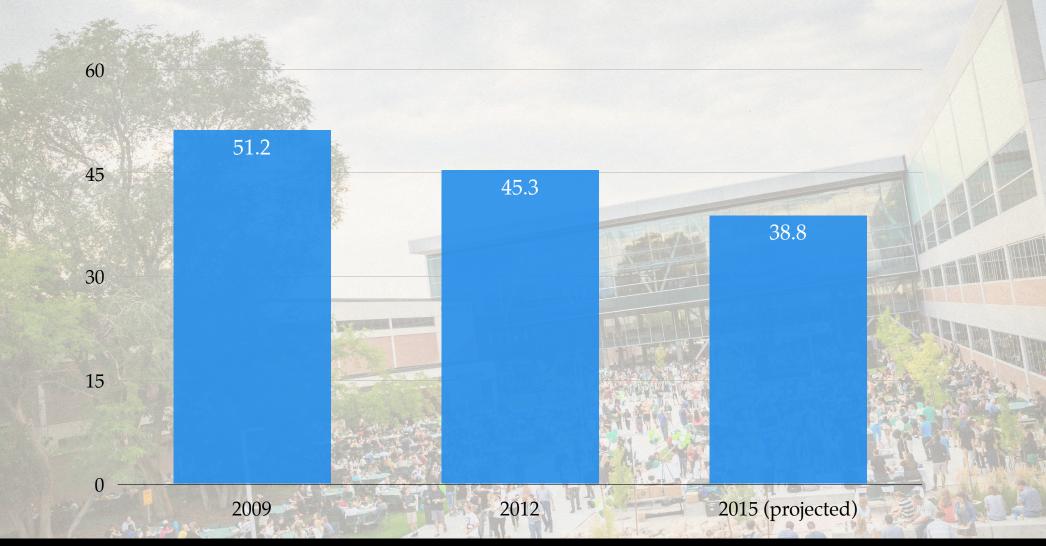


Top Budget Priority Investing in Full-time Faculty

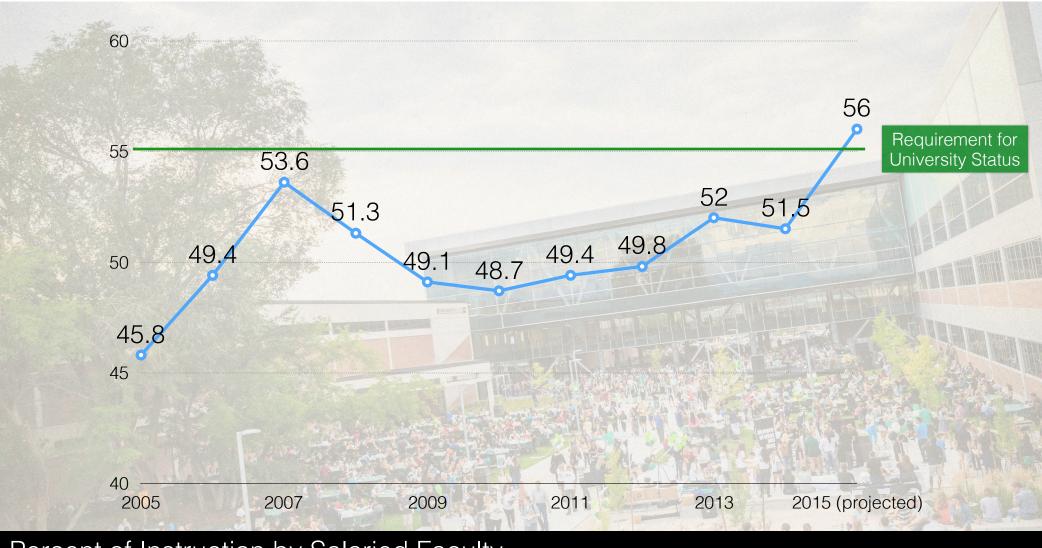


Staff Per Faculty Ratios:

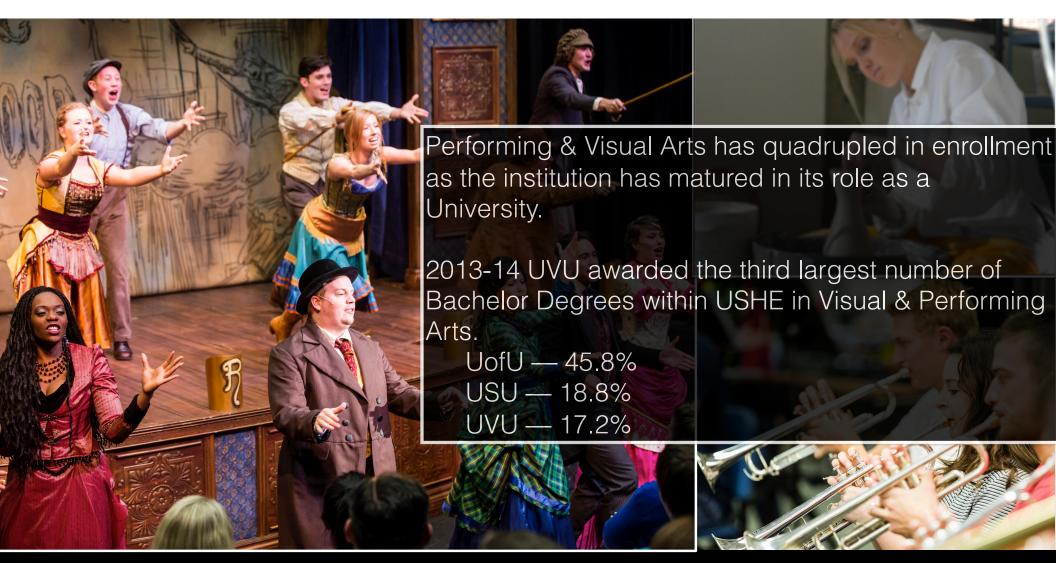

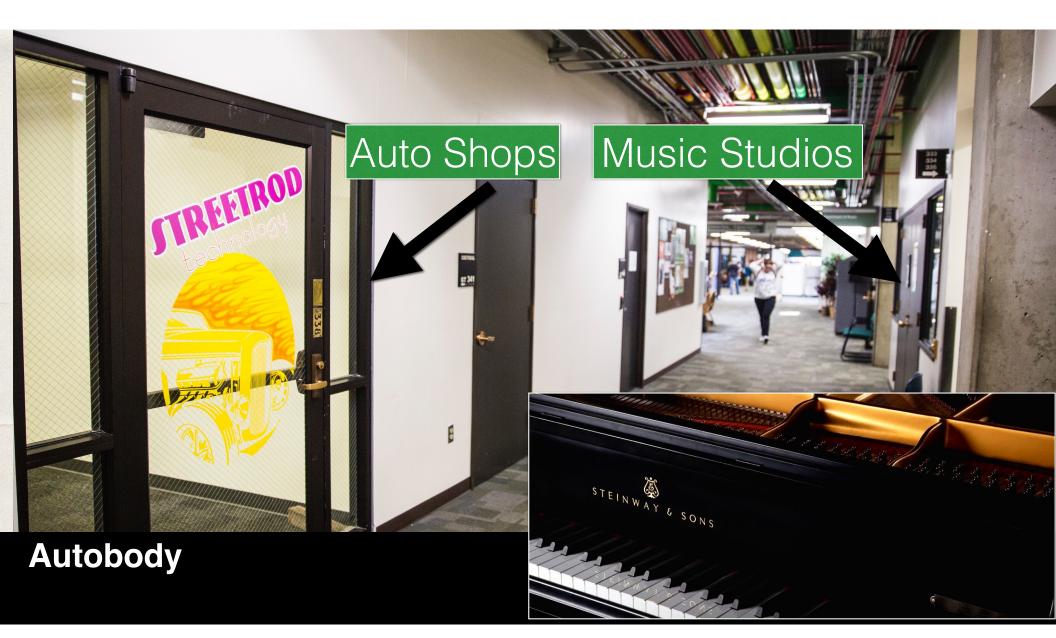
