Policies 525, 524, 522:

- Policy 525 Credit for Prior Learning
- Policy 522 Undergraduate Credit and Transcripts
- Policy 524 Graduate Program Credit and Graduation Requirements

Section 4.4 was added to Policy 524 so the policy would be in compliance with NWCCU accreditation standards. NWCCU accreditation standards have since changed, so credit for experiential learning from work experience is no longer prohibited by NWCCU accreditation

Susan presented on Policy 525 and informed it has moved to stage 2.

Policy 524 - It was mirrored from North Western which prohibits credit for prior learning.

Departments and programs should not be able to set their own standards. We are currently allowing credit for prior learning, but it needs to be more organized and documented, because a turnover in faculty changes the standards. Not being consistent could potentially bring lawsuits.

Is there concern over loss of tuition? Statistics show that students do finish their degrees, and these PL credits are not used as revenue/tuition. The focus is more on completion than revenue for these students.

Most departments are already including some form of credits for prior learning. We are just looking to expand the undergraduate opportunities.

More discussions with Graduate Council and amending 524 recommended for future. See what makes sense on a graduate level. Move forward now with expanding the undergraduate programs, but letting Graduate Council decide later about graduate programs with a broader discussion.

Would like 525 in place for Fall and would like to keep moving forward. 524 can always be amended later down the road.

Everyone agreed to allow them to move 525 forward and leave graduate part out of it.

Additional Topics:

Jim asked for concerns on Programming having a practicum as a special topics issue. Will recommend them to include in their curriculum in the future. The committee did not have concerns.

Next Meeting:

Think about the possibilities on the graduate program and prior learning credits, and ways we can be flexible, but have consistent standards.
