This General Education survey was administered by email from September 7 to September 14, 2022. Invitations were sent to a random selection of 5,000 non-Concurrent Enrollment students as well as all full-time employees. Students who completed the survey were entered into a drawing to win one of ten \$50 gift cards to the UVU Bookstore.




Understanding General Education


"How confident are you that you understand <u>the</u> <u>purpose of General Education</u>?" (Students only)






Average Agreement with Statements about GE Mission by Class Level and Employee Type


