- Developed and wrote a draft university policy to govern faculty serving as associate deans. I am part of a policy drafting committee that is expanding the policy's scope to include faculty who serve as deans and vice presidents.

Department Chair, Behavioral Science Department Utah Valley University, January 2008 – June 2013

The Behavioral Science Department is one of the largest departments in CHSS. During the time that I was department chair it had over 20 full-time faculty from five disciplines (anthropology, family science, psychology, sociology, and social work), over 80 part-time faculty, over 2,000 majors, and over 350 degrees awarded annually. The department also had four full-time, professional academic advisors and two administrative assistants.

As Department Chair I worked closely with the Dean, Associate Dean, and the faculty and staff in Behavioral Science to promote student success, to develop curriculum, and to refine the operation of the department. Key achievements include the following:

Dissertation—Judging Contingencies Accurately: The Effects of Feedback, Practice, and Self-Efficacy

Dissertation Adviser—Victor Benassi, Ph.D.

I selected the psychology program at the University of New Hampshire (UNH) in large part because of its nationally recognized Preparing Future Faculty Program which provides graduate students with extensive training to help them become excellent teachers. I was one of the first group of students at UNH to earn a cognate (certificate) in college teaching while I was earning my Ph.D.

My doctoral research was on the human judgement of contingency (correlation between actions and outcomes) using a computer program that I developed with another faculty member. The program allowed for several innovations in this area of research including calculating the actual contingency that the participants experienced, as opposed to the programmed contingency, and providing feedback to participants about the accuracy of their judgements. I found that providing feedback improves participants' accuracy in judging contingencies, but that it remains difficult for people to accurately assess low levels of contingency.
