



BFA Application Guidelines Ceramics and Sculpture

To be accepted into the BFA for Ceramics/Sculpture, students must apply for acceptance into the program by: 1) submitting a letter of intent and a portfolio, and 2) taking part in an interview.

The letter of intent and portfolio are due no later than the first Friday in March. Please submit both to the Coordinator of Ceramics/Sculpture, Professor Brian Jensen via email at: jensenbr@uvu.edu

After the application is submitted, Professor Jensen will contact the student via email and let him/her know of the exact date and time of the review.

Letter of Intent

Please write a 1-page Letter of Intent. The letter should include why you want to enter the BFA program in Ceramics/Sculpture, why you want to be an artist, who/what are your artistic influences, your preferred media and the content or subject of your work. Your contact information should also be written on this page. Please include your name, UVID, address, phone number and email address.

Portfolio

A portfolio of best works should be submitted digitally as either: 1) an email attachment or 2) a link to an online portfolio (include the link in your application email).

The portfolio must consist of 15-20 examples of the student's best and most recent work (within 18 months). Work should demonstrate a clear focus in overall concept and direction. An individual 'voice' should be discernable in the body of work. Do not include drawings or paintings from basic courses, or any work (such as photographs, ceramics, sculpture, graphics, illustrations, etc.) that does not relate to the student's single, chosen discipline/medium.

Include in your application a list of all works with title, medium, size and date of completion. Each work must be labeled with the title of the work (either in the file name or on the image itself).

Eligibility

Matriculation into the BFA program requires an AA, AS, or AAS Degree or equivalent in Art & Design or advisor approval. In order to be eligible for the BFA program, students must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 within the A&D department and a minimum overall GPA of 2.0. In order to stay in the program, these minimum GPAs must be maintained.
