


FULTON LIBRARY ONLINE RESOURCES IMPACT STUDY

The Fulton Library Online Resources Impact study was undertaken to determine if accessing the library's vast array of online resources increased persistence in degree-seeking undergraduate students.

OVERALL RESULTS

Results from the overall analysis showed significant positive lifts in persistence for students.



SUB-GROUP RESULTS

The analyses of sub-groups showed positive movement in persistence among several different groups, many of them significant. One demographic that had a significant lift in persistence across multiple sub-group analyses was the Bottom Persistence Predication Quartile (BPPM). There was significant lift in persistence for students in the BPPM across several sub-groups and in the overall analysis.
