

2020 Non-Returning Student Survey

Institutional Research attempted to contact all degree-seeking, new-to-UVU students from the 2019-20 academic year who did not return to UVU for the Fall 2020 semester (and who did not graduate). This survey was conducted by phone between October 19 and November 20, 2020.

We spoke with 965 of the 4,330 students whom we attempted to contact, which gives us a 22.3% response rate and a 2.8% margin of error. We spoke with another 1,068 parents or other adults speaking on behalf of the students, but only asked this group about post-UVU activities which are presented on page 2 (47.0% response rate and 1.6% margin of error).

Key Findings

- The most popular activities that non-returning students were doing instead of attending UVU were working (34.8%) or attending another school (14.5%). The percentage of non-returning students who were serving religious missions dropped from 17.9% in 2019 to 7.3% in 2020.
- The most popular reason why students chose not to return was disliking online classes (45.0%). The next most popular reason that wasn't related to course delivery method was that they could not afford to attend college (29.1%).
- 42.2% of non-returning students said that COVID-19 had a great or moderate contribution on their decision to not attend UVU. 37.7% said it had no contribution.
- 38.2% of non-returning students said that they plan on returning to UVU sometime in 2021.
- The most popular ways that non-returning students paid for college were work (32.9%), grants or scholarships (31.2%), and savings (29.3%).
- 63.4% of non-returning students said there was nothing that UVU could have done to help them return for the Fall 2020 semester.



Post-UVU Activities


Students and Parents Combined, Multiple Responses Allowed

*Most commonly mentioned "Other" reasons for not returning to UVU:


- Taking a Break (20 responses)

- Didn't Want to Go Into Debt (6)


"Do you think these financial reasons will be...?" (n = 246)







"Would financial assistance have made a difference in your decision to attend UVU this Fall semester?" (n = 256)




"What amount per semester would have affected your decision to attend Fall semester?"

Only asked of students who indicated that financial assistance would have made a difference. (n = 197)




"Would you accept part or all of the assistance as...?"

"How much did COVID-19 precautions or events contribute to your decision to not attend UVU this Fall semester?" (n = 951)




Most Common Categories of Responses to "What were the COVID precautions or events that contributed to your decision to not attend?"



"Do you plan to attend UVU in the future? If yes, when?" (n = 947)






"During your first year at UVU, were you assigned a peer mentor?" (n = 928)




"How helpful was your peer mentor in increasing your sense of belonging at UVU?"

"If you had been assigned a peer mentor, how likely would you have been to reach out to them?"


Only asked of students who DID NOT indicate they had been assigned a peer mentor. (n = 724)



"Did you apply for and accept any financial aid?"




"Why didn't you accept your financial aid award?"

Only asked of students who DID NOT use financial aid to pay for school, and who DID NOT apply for financial aid. Multiple Responses Allowed






Percentage of Students Who Agree or Strongly Agree with Each Statement
