

Affective Partisan Polarization and Support for Democratic Norms in Utah and the United States

Fall/Winter 2022-23

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About this Survey

As part of the ongoing efforts of its Civic Thought and Leadership Initiative, Utah Valley University [UVU] administered a survey to a sample of voting age Utahns to assess their level of affective partisan polarization and their support for democratic norms. In addition, the survey was administered nationally to a representative sample of voting age Americans as well for comparison.

For the Utah sample, UVU contracted with YouGov to administer an online survey to a statewide representative sample of 1000 Utahns, aged 18 and up. The survey was administered December 21, 2022 – January 17, 2023. For the national sample, the same online survey was distributed to a national representative sample of 4348 Americans, aged 18 and up, by Lucid LLC. The survey was administered to the national sample November 14, 2022 – November 24, 2022.

Respondents were asked a series of questions designed to assess: 1) their attitudes and feelings about individuals who have political views that are different from their own, and 2) their level of support for commonly acknowledged norms of a democratic society (e.g. the rule of law, belief in the notion of political equality, the value of checks and balances in the political system, and in the value of compromise, etc).

The selection of questions was inspired by research by Kingzette et al (2021) in which they demonstrate that affective partisan polarization can undermine support for democratic norms. The question is whether such polarization is present to the same degree in Utah, and whether its link to support for democratic norms is similar to that found by Kingzette et al.

The survey was designed by Dr. Jay DeSart, Associate Professor of Political Science, along with the students in his *Survey Research Methods* class in the Fall 2022 semester. Topline Results

We'd like to ask how you feel towards various groups on a scale of 0 to 100, which we call a "Feeling Thermometer." On this feeling thermometer scale, ratings between 0 and 49 degrees mean that you feel unfavorable and cold (with 0 being the most unfavorable/coldest). Ratings between 51 and 100 degrees mean that you feel favorable and warm (with 100 being the most favorable/warmest). A rating of 50 means you have no feelings one way or another.

Methodological and Weighting Information

Utah Sample

YouGov distributed the survey to 1197 respondents (18+ residents of Utah) who were then matched down to a sample of 1000 to produce the final dataset. The respondents were matched to a sampling frame on gender, age, race, and education. The frame was constructed by stratified sampling from the full 2019 American Community Survey (ACS) 1-year sample with selection within strata by weighted sampling with replacements (using the person weights on the public use file).

The matched cases were weighted to the sampling frame using propensity scores. The matched cases and the frame were combined and a logistic regression was estimated for inclusion in the frame. The propensity score function included age, gender, race/ethnicity, years of education, and region. The propensity scores were grouped into deciles of the estimated propensity score in the frame and post-stratified according to these deciles.

The weights were then post-stratified on 2016 and 2020 Presidential vote choice, a four-way stratification of gender, age (four categories), race (three categories), and education (four categories), a two-way stratification of age (four categories) and race (three categories), and a two-way stratification of Education (four categories) and race (three categories), to produce the final weight.

National Sample

The survey was distributed online to a national sample of 5109 respondents (18+ residents of the United States) by Lucid, LLC. Respondents were recruited for this sample from many sample providers in the Lucid marketplace. More information about the Lucid marketplace and the data quality tests they employ are available here. Quotas on race, Hispanic ethnicity, sex, and age were applied prior to the commencement of the administration of the survey. As a quality-control measure, an open-ended question was included to filter-out invalid responses from inattentive respondents. These responses were individually inspected by the poll director, who then deleted 109 cases that were invalid.

A rake weight procedure was employed to calculate sample weights using a three-way stratification of age (two categories), sex (two categories), and education (four categories), a stratification of race (four categories), a stratification of Hispanic ethnicity (two categories), and a stratification of income (nine categories).
