We are also in the process of planning the next Elder Quest Annual Scholarship Seminar to be held April 10, 2019 in the UVU Ballroom. I have attended all the E Q classes this semester and I have been delighted and edified with the information I have gleaned from the classes and Potpourri Lectures. We will lose Jeannie Griffiths and Gary Browning after the fall semester. We would like to thank them for their outstanding classes. We have been "bulging at the seams" in the classroom and I hope this hasn't discouraged anyone from coming to Elder Quest.

Next semester classes will start on January 21, 2019 at the **Provo Senior Center** and will continue for 10 weeks. You will need to register with the Provo Senior Center, 270 West 500 North in Provo and you can do that **now**. They are open from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. Monday-Saturday. Your membership will be good for a full year. If you register now, you will have a membership until this time next year. You will be issued a card that will give you access to the senior center and they will take your picture for the card. If you are not a citizen of Provo, you will need to tell them that you belong to Elder Quest to get the \$10 fee. Normally the fee for citizens of communities other than Provo is \$100. Visitors accompanied by a member or people who want to investigate E Q before they join will be allowed to come once before joining. If you participate in the "Silver Sneakers" program, ask them about the fee for you.

You do not need to register with **Elder Quest** again for this semester. Your \$40 membership is for the whole year.

The Provo Senior Center is not well marked. It is part of the Provo Recreation Center and is on the **east side** (Freedom Blvd side) of the building. Go in the **east doors** and walk to the desk. There are handicap parking spaces just outside the east entrance. There is also a large parking lot on the east side. If you would like to tour the center, they would love to take you.

Please take responsibility for signing up with the Provo Senior Center. You will need their card to get into the first Elder Quest class on January 21, 2019. If you wait until that day to sign up, you will have to wait in line and will probably miss part of the first class.

Be aware that if you sign up with the Provo Senior Center that you **can** still be a member of the Orem Senior Friendship Center. Their membership goes from January 1 to December 31, so you will need to sign up with them again after the first of the year. If your over 80 it's free.

We want you to come with us to Provo for our E Q classes. The Elder Quest Board has been working hard to find just the right classes and activities to keep us intellectually stimulated and well informed. We love you. We value each one of you and strive to make Elder Quest valuable for you.

A note from Alan to Elder Quest

I can't recall another class I've taught (in a teaching career spanning nearly half a century) which I enjoyed as much as our class last year on the life and works of the poet Leslie Norris. You Elder Quest students were terrific and responded to Leslie's remarkable poems and stories in profound and sometimes unexpectedly personal ways which deeply moved and gratified me.

In the end I came to realize that one major unintended result of the class was that I think I observed people falling in love with real poetry, some for the first time. (It's easy to think of poetry as either some kind of rhyming sentimentality or, on the other extreme, some kind of puzzlingly abstract idiosyncratic construct.) Through Leslie's poetry I think we all came to understand what real poetry is and to love good poetry more generally.

I'd like to repeat that experience somehow. Not unlike poetry, one of the arts that we often think of as too abstract, high-falutin, snooty, outdated, and downright BORING! is opera. (And some operas are all those things, let's face it.)

But there is one remarkable opera that has the power to charm children, teenagers, adults, old fogies and opera buffs alike: Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's last opera (composed not long before his death in 1791), called The Magic Flute. I think it is impossible not to fall head-over-heels in love with The Magic Flute. I confidently predict that at the end of the course most, if not all our students, will consider themselves passionate opera lovers.

The Magic Flute's plot is brilliantly simple and accessible to all ages -- it's a fairy tale setting of a love story involving a prince and a princess, a charming bird-catcher who looks just like a bird himself, a horribly wicked and devious queen and a righteous high priest -- not to mention magical musical instruments -- but the plot is philosophically also almost bottomlessly profound. It deals with the search for truth amid a fog of falsehoods, it examines whether women and men are truly equals, whether all races are sons and daughters of deity, and finally it tells us of the infinite potential of the human race.



SENIOR PASS APPLICATION

Application is hereby made for Senior Pass privileges to the Provo Recreation Center, owned and operated by Provo City Parks and Recreation (PCPR). I understand that pass privileges are established through policies adopted by PCPR and I agree to abide by all present and future policies, rules and regulations of PCPR.

The Senior Annual Pass is a limited use annual pass for senior-focused activities on the Community side at the Provo Recreation Center. Pricing is for lump-sum payments of \$10 a year for residents and Elder Quest Participants and \$100 a year for non-residents. Proof of residency must be shown at time of registration.

SENIOR PASS AGREEMENT

1. Payment: All payments to the Recreation Center are subject to refund policies of the Recreation Center.
 - a. Full Payment: Under this option, a payment of \$_____ must accompany the Application.
2. Membership Cards: Cards are issued to all pass holders. Lost cards can be replaced for a \$5 fee. Allowing someone to use your card, may result in your membership being revoked.
3. Pass Privileges: Pass holders will be admitted to public activities such as scheduled track walking time, senior swim time, select fitness classes on the senior side, game room access (8am-10pm), book club, discounts on senior tours, wellness room access (8am-10pm), library and computer lab access (8am-3pm), bingo, and informational luncheons at no additional charge. The Senior Annual Pass does not include access to fitness classes located on the main side of the facility, swimming during hours that are not approved, or using the upstairs fitness mezzanine with the exception of the track walking time.
4. Elder Quest: If you wish to attend Elder Quest classes, you must also fill out an application and pay dues to Elder Quest.
5. To utilize the full facility and any other features not included in the Senior Pass, a day pass or a full membership must be purchased. If at any time inappropriate/unapproved usage occurs, the Senior Pass may be suspended. If continued abuse of the Senior Pass is observed for more than one time, the price of a full access membership will be invoiced.
6. The Resident Senior Pass is non-refundable after 7 days. The Non-Resident Senior Pass follows the cancellation policy.
7. Age Requirements: To qualify for the Senior Pass, participants must be 60 years or older. Spouses under 60 are eligible for a senior pass if their spouse is 60 years or older.
8. Rental Equipment/Lockers: The Recreation Center provides some equipment for a daily rental fee. If patrons would like to use a locker, they can provide their own lock. Any personal locks left on the lockers at the end of the day will be cut off and all contents of the locker will be put in the lost and found. Lost and found items are held for up to one week and then donated to a local charity.
9. Member's Conduct: Members agrees to follow the rules and regulations for the Recreation Center in accordance with the Patron Code of Conduct. Any Members who do not comply with the rules of the Recreation Center, may be expelled and/or have their membership revoked pursuant to the Refund Policy guidelines.
10. Waiver: Member affirms that participation in the activities or services provided by the Recreation Center are voluntary, and acknowledges that there are inherent risks in such participation that cannot be eliminated. Member assumes full responsibility for any and all injuries or damages which may occur to Member or their dependents as a result of such inherent risks associated with such activities or services provided by the Recreation Center. I hereby agree, on my behalf and on behalf of my dependents, to release, indemnify, and hold harmless Provo City Corporation, or any of its directors, officers, agents, employees, sponsors, and volunteers from any liability, loss, cost, or expense (including attorney fees, medical and ambulance costs) suffered by me or my dependents arising from my or my dependents participation in any activity at the Recreation Center. 


