The Mystery Of Agatha Christie



What's new about Agatha Christie? The back cover of the recent biography of Christie by Lucy Worsley (OBE, Curator of historic royal palaces, documentarian for the BBC, and author) poses these questions: Why did Agatha Christi pretend she was "just an ordinary housewife" when she wasn't? She surfed in Hawaii, loved fast cars, was a prolific poet and wrote a revealing but mystery-ridden autobiography. She had many suitors as an Edwardian debutante and also served as a wartime nurse in both world wars.

She married twice, the "men of her dreams," or nightmares. She was an

unconventional mother of her only child and was intrigued by the science of psychology, which helped her through a devastating mental illness. So why, "despite all the evidence to the contrary, did Agatha Christi present herself as a retiring Edwardian lady of leisure?" We'll pursue the answer from lesser-known sources as well as in her wellknown novels and short stories, such as her own autobiography, her poetry, and her dramas.

This course will look beyond the books—and the films—to the author herself to find answers to these questions and open windows to a remarkable woman's private life and art.

1:00-2:00 PM Linda Knight World War II: Secrets, Surprises And Spies



With Adolph Hitler leading a German invasion of Poland in 1939, World War II was launched - a deadly global conflict waged across Europe and the Pacific until 1945. Bloody battles raged between the Allied powers, which included Britain, France, the Soviet Union and the United States along with other nations, and the Axis, notably Germany and Japan. When the Axis ultimately surrendered, some 20 million soldiers were dead, along with an estimated 40 million civilians.

Join us this fall as we become a witness to the leaders, countries, battles and strategies of this period of our world's history. As the class title suggests, there will be some secrets, surprises and spy stories as well.

2:15-3:15 Bruce Young

C. S. Lewis's Last Great Novel, Till We Have Faces

The main purpose of this class will be to read, ponder, discuss, and experience the depth and power of C.



S. Lewis's last great novel, *Till We Have Faces*, a retelling of the Cupid and Psyche myth through the eyes of Psyche's jealous sister. Though Lewis felt it was his best creative work, it is among his less well known – and it is challenging to read, which is one reason you may want to benefit from the insights of class members as you read it.

Till We Have Faces deals with some of Lewis's most important ideas: love in its many manifestations; faith and the challenge of accepting spiritual realities that surpass our understanding; and the difficult process of surrendering our pride and fears in order to know God and truly love others. The novel's title comes from a line near the end of the book that sums up

the deep transformation we need to experience: "How can the gods meet us face to face till we have faces?" The book is strongly influenced by Lewis's relationship with his future wife, Joy Gresham. With that in mind,

we'll connect the book is strongly initiative by Lewis's relationship with its rulate whe, by Gresham. With that in finite, we'll connect the book with Lewis's life, especially his relationship and eventual marriage with Joy and his response to her death, as these are portrayed in the movie *Shadowlands* and in Lewis's book *A Grief Observed*. Though our focus will be on Lewis's last great novel, your experience with the book will be enriched as you see it in the context of Lewis's life and ideas.

Explore a wide range of musical gems – from towering symphonic and choral works to delicate and touching personal expressions. As always, Marden will share fascinating background vignettes to introduce and give insights into each work.

Topics may include: music inspired by Shakespeare & Goethe, music of Americana, Music of the spheres, ballet and opera scores, requiems and music of mourning, and others. Composers may include: Rimsky-Korsakov, Brahms, Mendelssohn, Richard Strauss, Mozart, Gustav Holst, Vaughan Williams, and selected works by Marden Pond.

It has been almost 50 years since China left behind Marxist economics and embraced "socialism with Chinese characteristics," which looks to most people like capitalism. Since then, the Chinese economy has grown faster, and lifted more people out of poverty, than any country in history. But China's economy is now seen by many as a threat.

Have the Chinese figured out how to harness market economics better than the rest of the world? How do they make the most advanced, and cheapest, electric vehicles? How did they corner the market on rare earth minerals that everyone's technological hopes rely on? How can they afford the world's largest foreign aid program when the United States has all but given up helping foreign countries? Have they discovered something we don't know, or are they going

to wither like Japan did?

Who We Are

- Elder Quest is a unique organization sponsored by Utah Valley University.
- Our major purpose is to provide life-long learning opportunities for seniors 55 and older.
- We're now in our 30th year! Last year we served over 200 members throughout Utah Valley.

What We Do

- 1. We offer two semesters of classes per year. Fall semester begins mid-September and runs until shortly before Thanksgiving. Spring semester starts mid-January and runs mid to late March.
- 2. Ten to twelve classes are offered each semester. Each class is held once per week, ten classes per semester. Classes are held Monday through Thursday at the Provo Senior Center and are also available on-line via Zoom. Elder Quest members can take as many or as few classes as they desire. Classes require no homework or tests.
- 3. Classes include a variety of subjects (see fall class schedule on the back side of this page). Elder Quest teachers are skilled professionals. All teachers donate their time and effort simply because they love teaching Elder Quest.
- 4. In addition to regular classes, we hold a series of guest lectures each semester, our Elder Quest potpourris. Guest presenters teach one short class based on interest and expertise.
- 5. We sponsor monthly luncheons prepared and served by UVU Culinary Arts students. Three or four day trips each semester take us to fascinating places and afford the opportunity. to socialize together. Elder Quest also shows weekly Friday movies at the Orem Public Library.
- 6. Our Elder Quest scholarships provide financial aid to non-traditional UVU students. Following Spring semester an outstanding one-day seminar is held, featuring excellent speakers and outstanding entertainment. Here we ask members to dig deep and contribute to our UVU Non-Traditional Student Scholarship program.
