

For the Spring 2020 semester, you will have the option of selecting a letter grade or a Credit (CR) grade for each of your courses. We STRONGLY RECOMMEND that you select the letter grade (A through E) for all of your courses. However, if you choose to select the Credit (CR) option, this means that you met the standards for successful completion of the course and you earned Credit for the class. This document is meant to inform you of the letter grade the department has identified to equal Credit (CR).

If you choose to select the Credit (CR) option over a letter grade, please note that this can have negative implications for your educational journey. Some of these implications include: financial aid (you may have to pay back), scholarships, applications for competitive entry programs, graduate school admissions and necessary pre-reqs, course transferability, international students, student athletes, and other factors.
