CERTIFICATIONS

Certificate of Completion - Paramedic

Recommendation to test for national certification requires a GPA of 3.0 or higher in paramedic courses.

- Certifications include BLS, ACLS, PALS, PEPP, AMLS, PHTLS, GEMS, LEFR, NRP, and Fundamentals of Airway.

PREREQUISITES

- Complete MAT 1000 or higher—QL highly recommended
- Complete ENGL 1005 or ENGL 1010 (ENGL 2010 highly recommended)
- Complete required anatomy and physiology class(es) with at least a C grade
- Complete the paramedic application process and be formally admitted
- Successful completion of criminal background check

SCHEDULE

The paramedic program is completed over a two-semester period. (Course schedule is provider/shift friendly—speak to an advisor for more information)

- Spring/Summer (January-August)
- Fall/Spring (August-April)

THE PARAMEDIC PROGRAM OFFERS TWO DIFFERENT COHORTS:

Full Time Day program (complete in 2 semesters, provider/shift friendly)

- Fall/Spring (August-April) and Spring/Summer (January-August)
- Semester 1 Monday through Friday 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Semester 2 Clinicals and field work varies

Part Time Evening Program (Complete in 3 semesters)

- Spring/Summer/Fall
- Spring and Summer Semesters – 2 evenings a week 6 p.m. to 10 p.m. and various Saturdays
- Fall semester - Clinicals and field work varies

COURSE DELIVERY

All courses are taught face to face with hybrid learning components (online) and hands-on clinical experiences.
