Getting Started with Online Classes

Why take an online class?

- **Flexibility**: Online classes allow you to work on your own schedule—ideal for students who want to take more CE credits than their high school allows.
- Expanded Options: Access courses that may not be offered at your high school.
- **Progress Toward a Degree:** Online classes can help you complete General Education Certificate (GEC) or Associate of Science (AS) requirements.

What should I expect in an online class?

- **Self-Paced but Structured:** You'll work through weekly modules with readings, assignments, and deadlines.
- You're in Charge: Success requires time management and self-discipline.
- College-Level Rigor: These are real UVU college courses with high expectations.

What classes are offered online?

• We offer a variety of CE courses! Check the full list on our <u>website</u>.

Who teaches the online classes?

UVU professors teach all online CE classes.

Are these classes only for high school students?

• Yes. These online sections are exclusively for Concurrent Enrollment students, though your classmates may come from different high schools in Utah.

Registration & Enrollment

How do I register for an online class?

• Registration follows the same steps as any other CE course. Find your course and use the CRN to register: https://www.uvu.edu/concurrent/registration

How do I know if I successfully registered for my online class?

Check your class schedule in your myUVU student portal to confirm enrollment.

What if I had to join the waitlist? How will I know when it's my turn to register?

• You'll get an email notification sent to your UVU email and you'll have **24 hours** to register before your spot is offered to the next student on the waitlist.

Can I register for a course at another high school if my school is full?

 No. You must register for CE courses at your own high school. If your class is full, join the waitlist.

What happens if I register for a class at a different high school?

• You'll be dropped from the class and asked to register through your own high school.

Who do I contact if I'm confused about registration?

• Start with your high school counselor. You can also reach out to your Concurrent Enrollment Coordinator for additional help.

Staying Connected

How do I communicate with my teacher if we don't meet?

• Your instructor's email will be listed in the syllabus. You can email them or send a canvas message anytime.

What support will I have?

- **Instructor:** Your main contact for class-related questions.
- **Facilitator:** Your high school CE facilitator can help with registration, troubleshooting, and general guidance.
- UVU Service Desk: For tech or account issues, call 801-863-8888.

Technology & Access

What technology do I need for an online class?

• You'll need a reliable computer or laptop and consistent internet access. Assignments will be submitted through Canvas.

Where do I log in to access my class?

• Go to canvas.uvu.edu and log in using your UVU credentials.

Costs & Materials

How much does an online class cost?

• Just \$5 per credit hour - same as all CE courses. Some classes may have additional fees for materials.

Do I have to pay for books or course materials?

• Possibly. Check your course syllabus for textbook or material requirements.

Changed & Deadlines

Can I drop an online class if I fall behind?

• Yes - but pay attention to deadlines. Check the CE calendar for drop and withdrawl dates.
