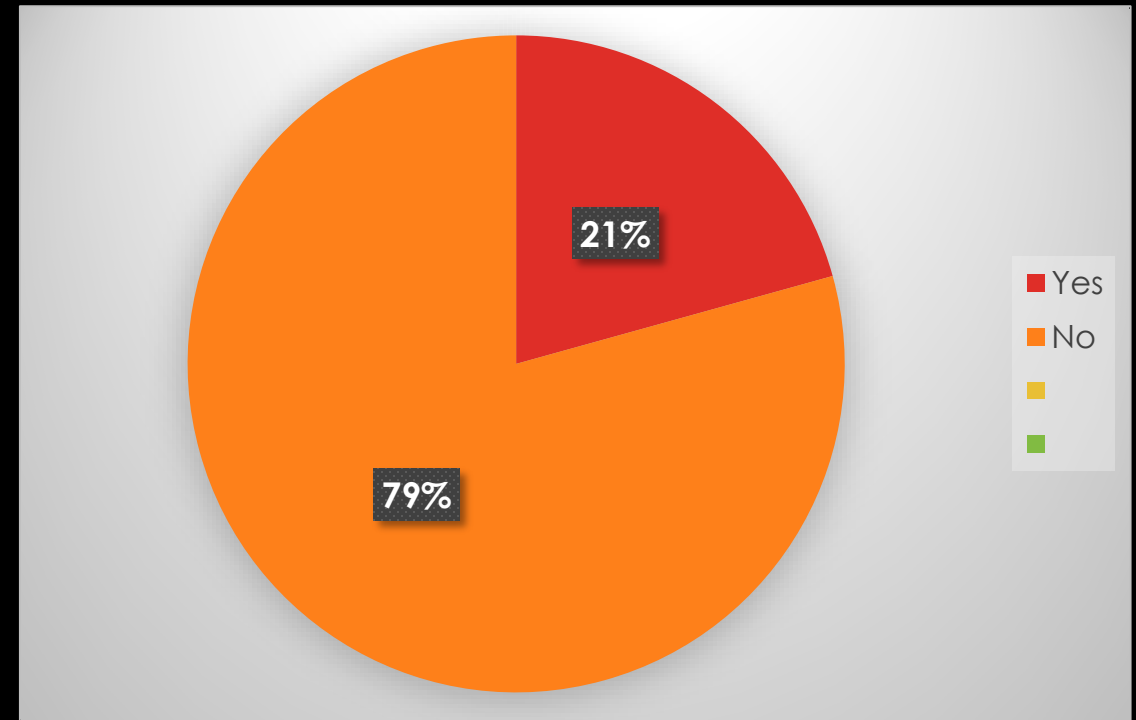

RESEARCH QUESTIONS

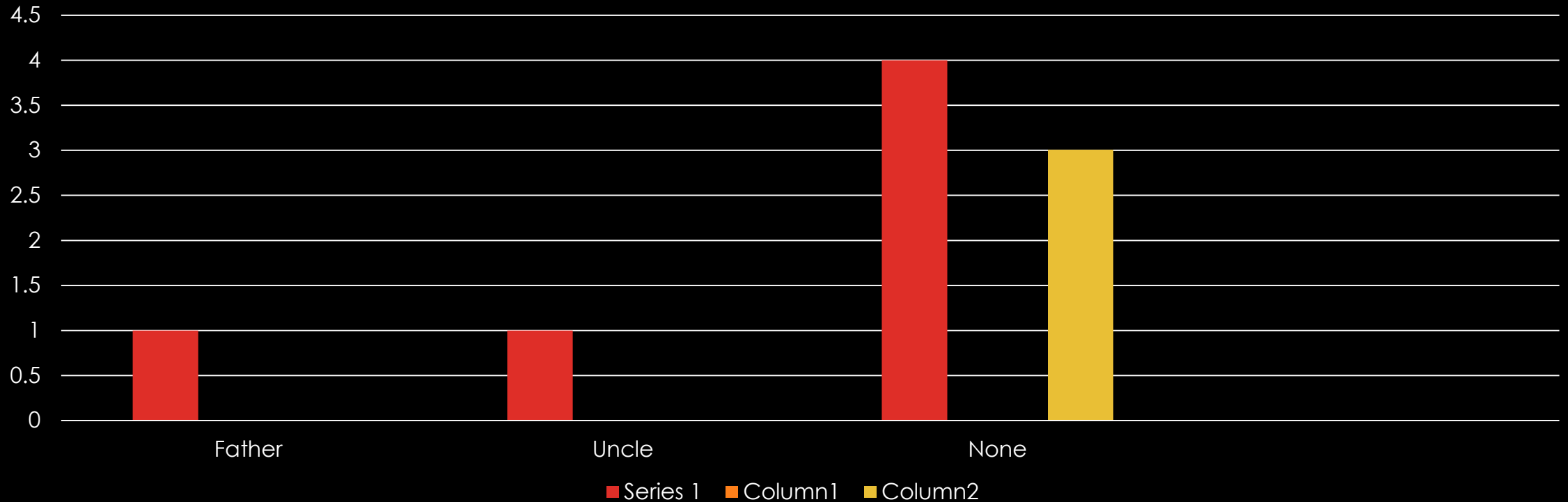
- At what age did you first start consuming alcohol?

Alcohol addiction in the family



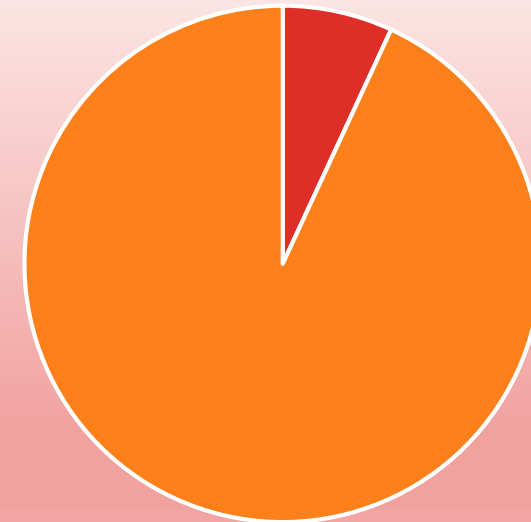
AT WHAT AGE DID YOU FIRST START CONSUMING ILLEGAL DRUGS?

NO: 93.10%

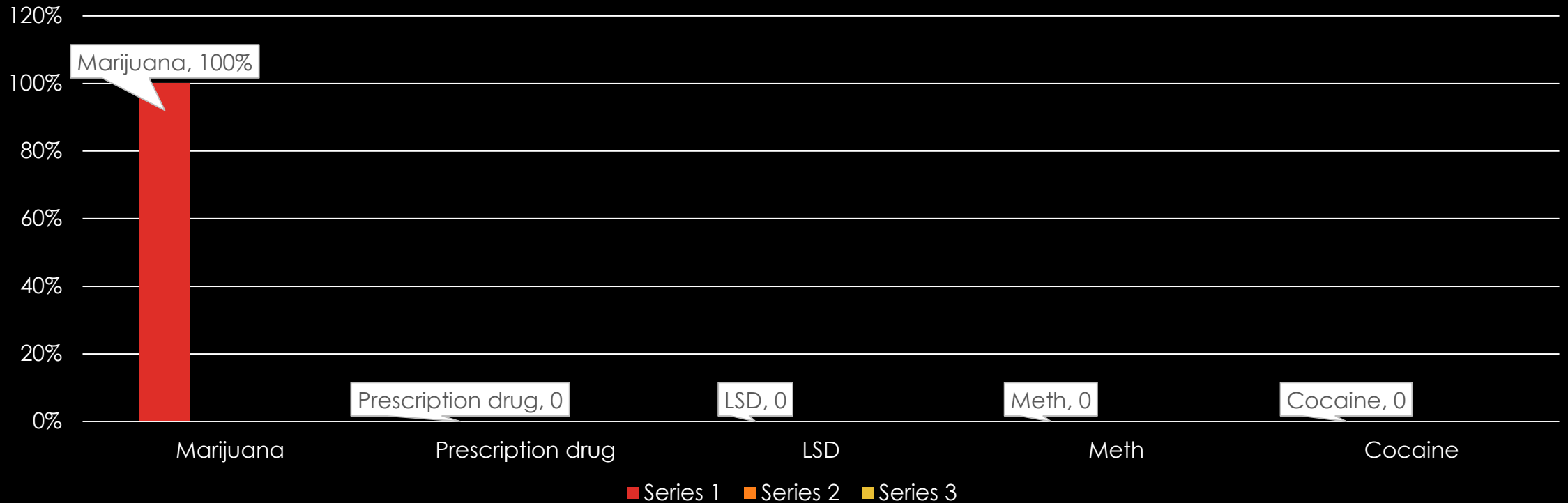
Do you use Illegal drugs

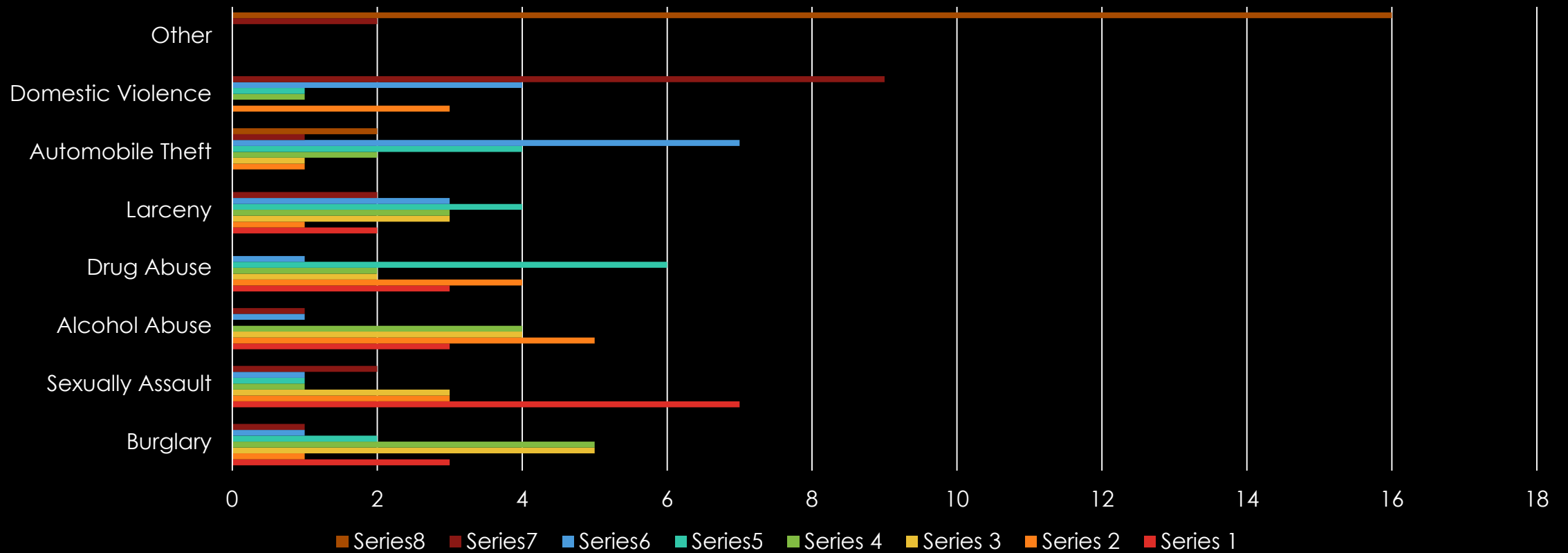
- Most students chose strongly agree

- We can prevent students from experimenting with drugs, we can prevent good chances keeping campus drug free zone.



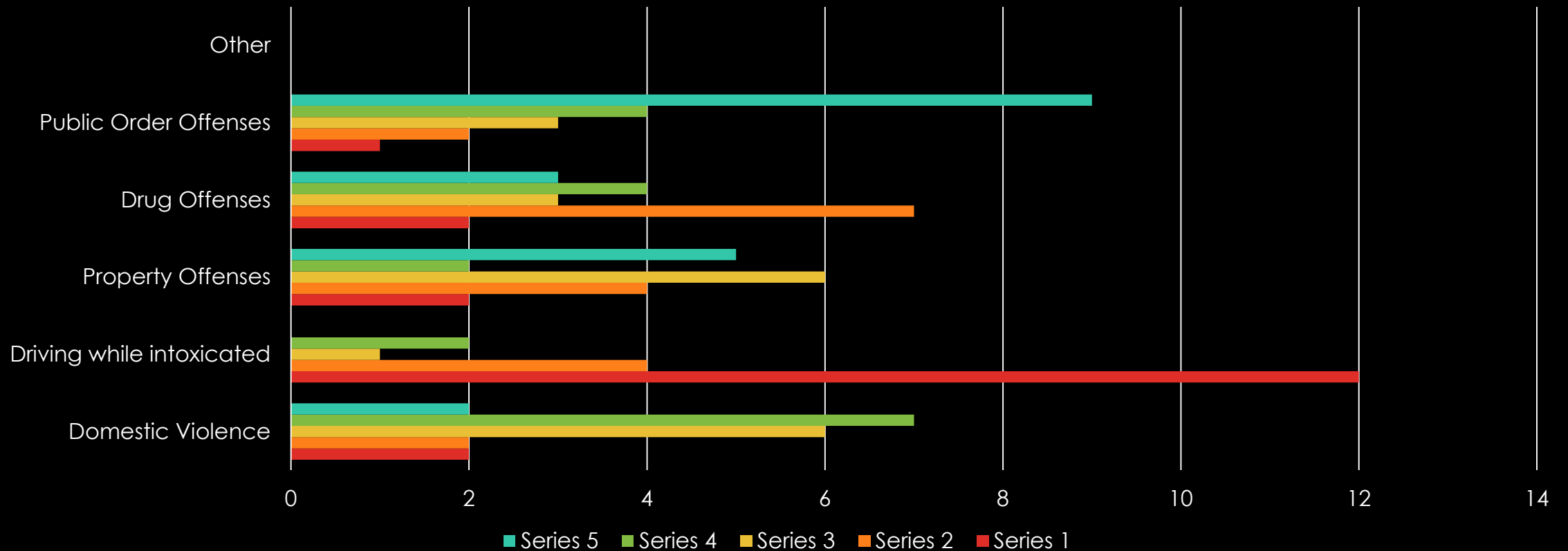
WHICH OF THE FOLLOWING FACTORS DO YOU BELIEVE MOST CONTRIBUTE TO CRIME AT UVU?

WHAT CRIME DO YOU BELIEVE DRUG AND ALCOHOL USERS ARE MOST LIKELY TO COMMIT AT UVU?



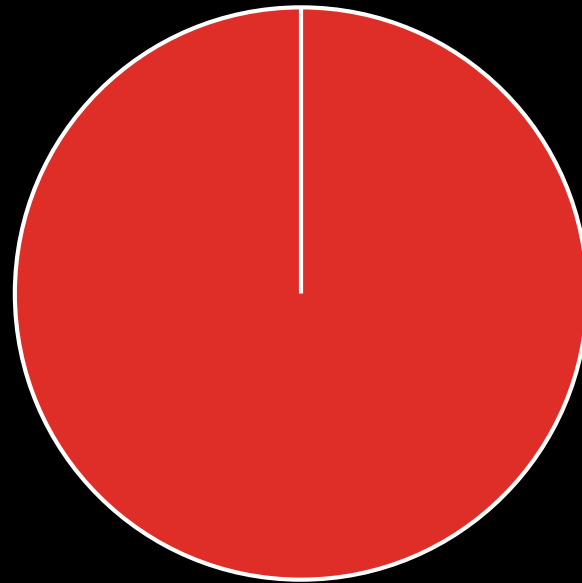


WERE YOU EVER THE VICTIM OF A CRIME WHILE YOU WERE UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL?

RESEARCH DESIGN

- Availability sampling method.
