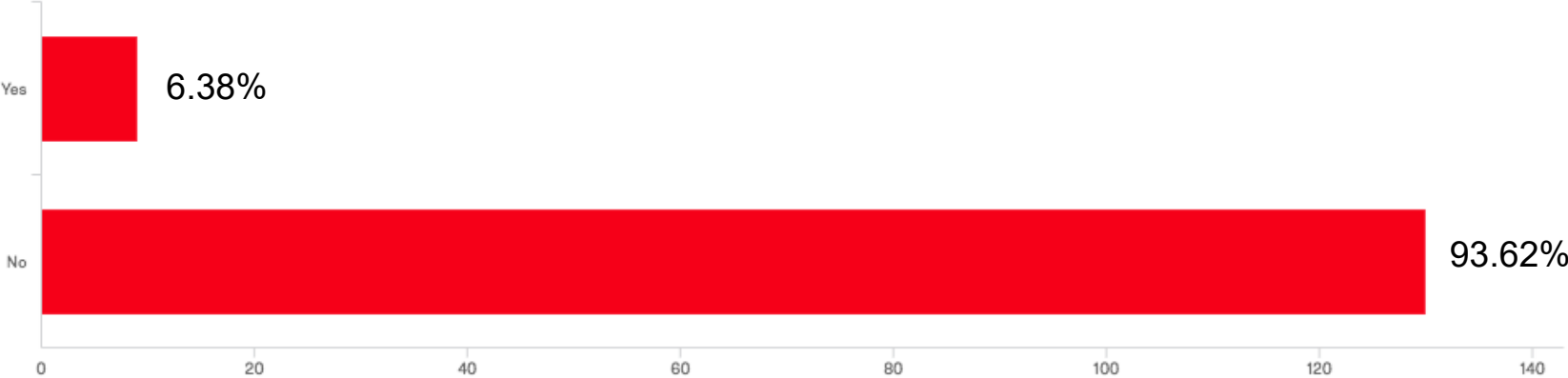

13 Sex Trafficking Statistics That Put the Worldwide Problem into Perspective:

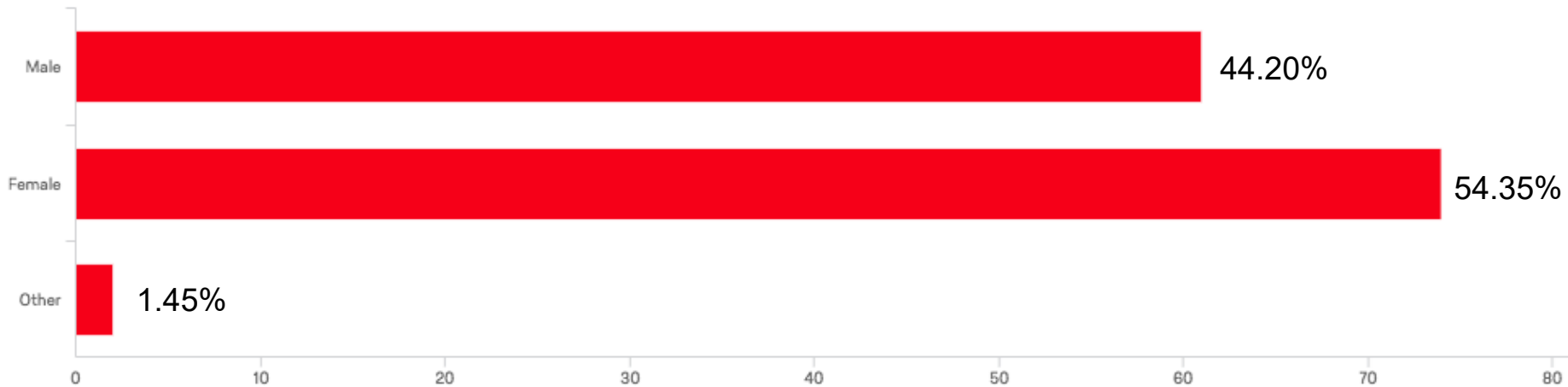

What is your gender?

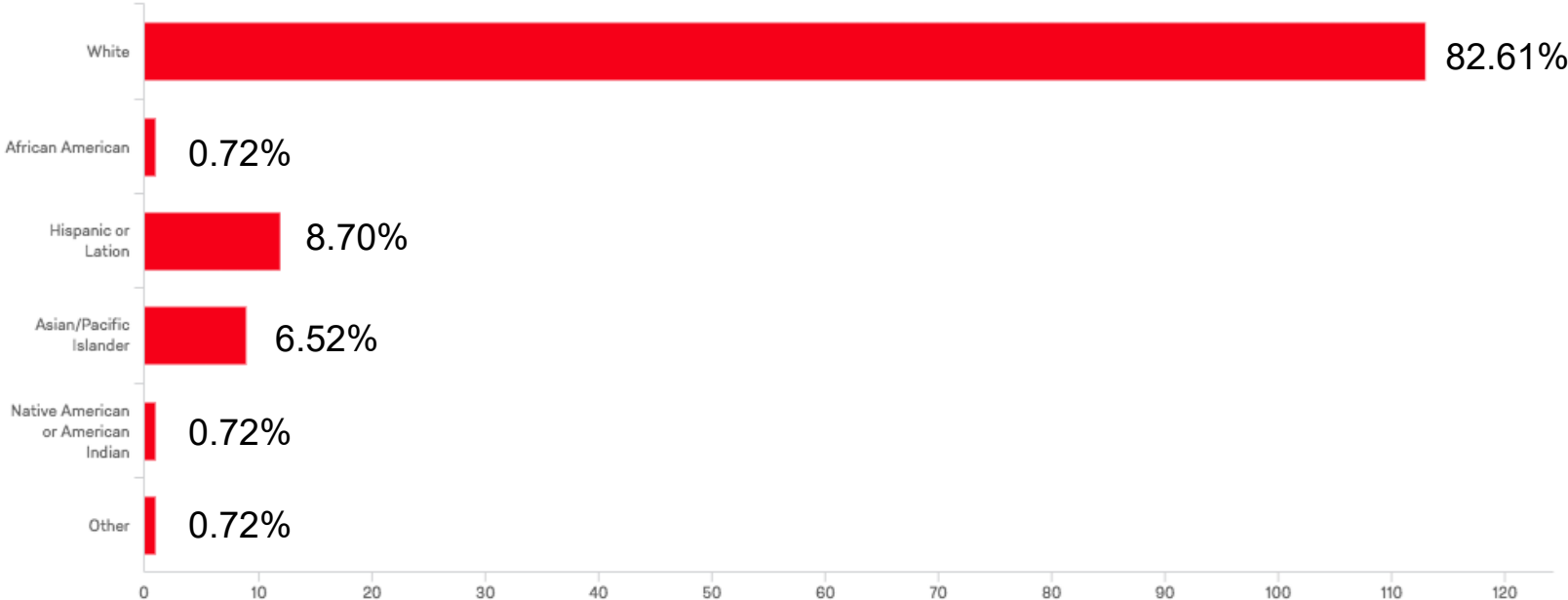


Cross Tabulation between their gender and if they or someone they know have been a victim of Sex Trafficking

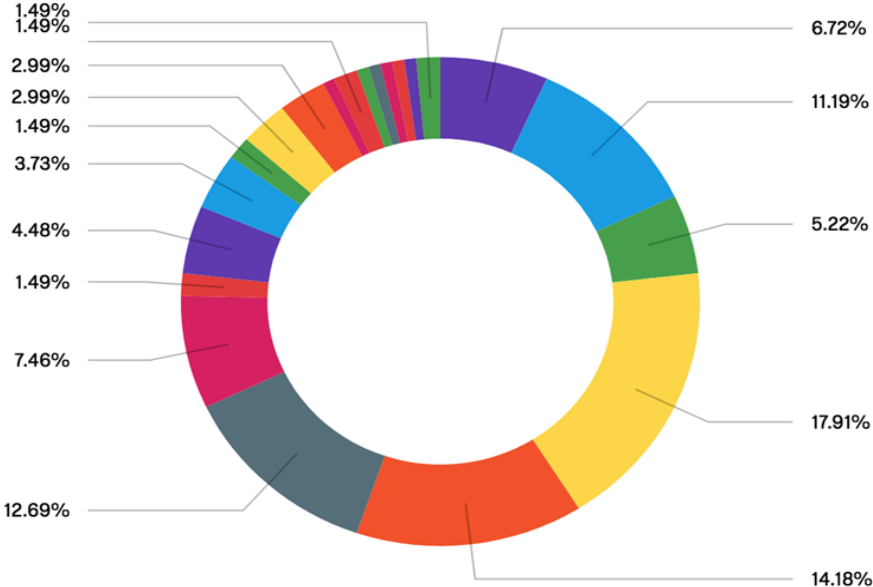

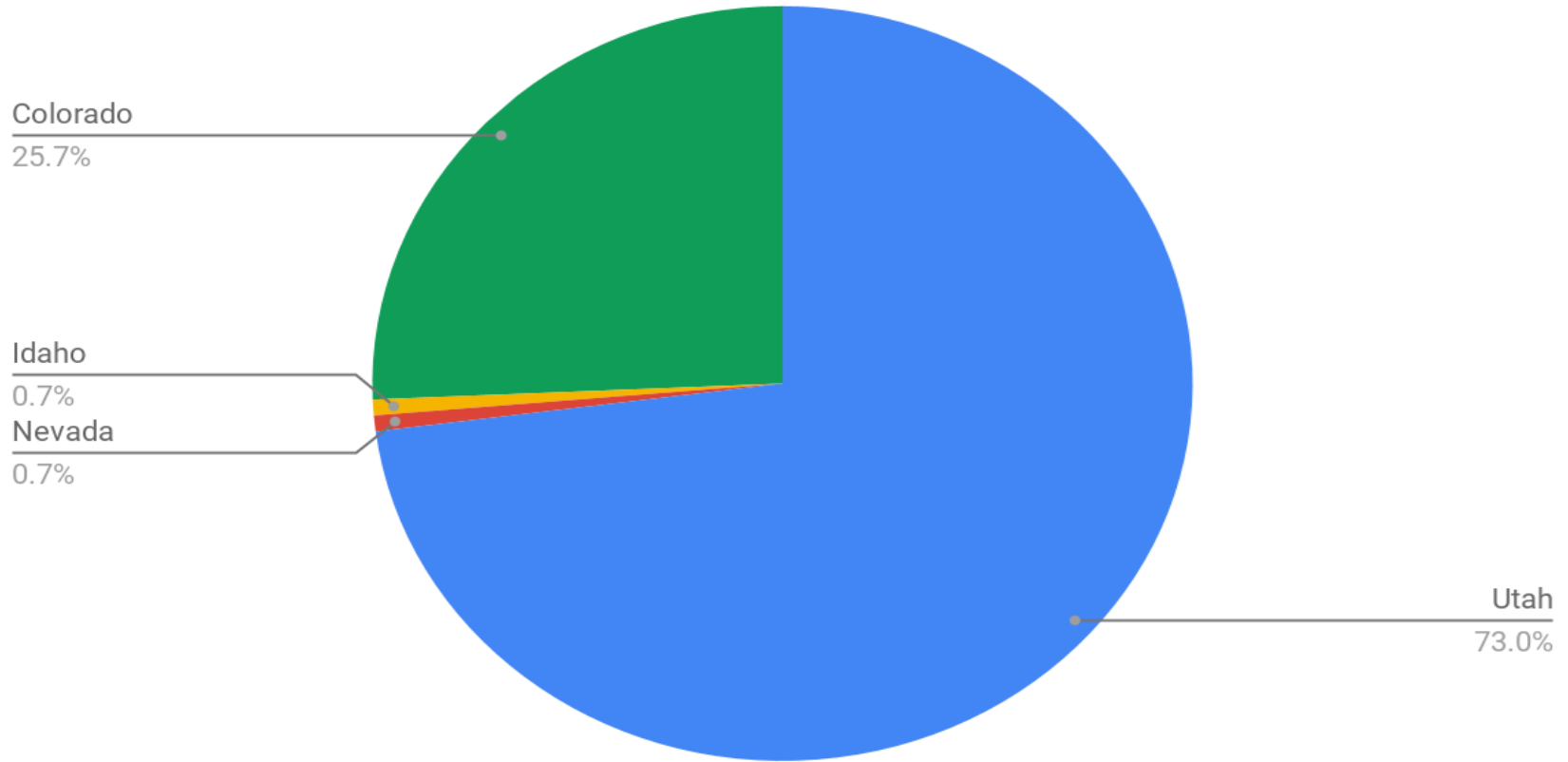
What is your race?

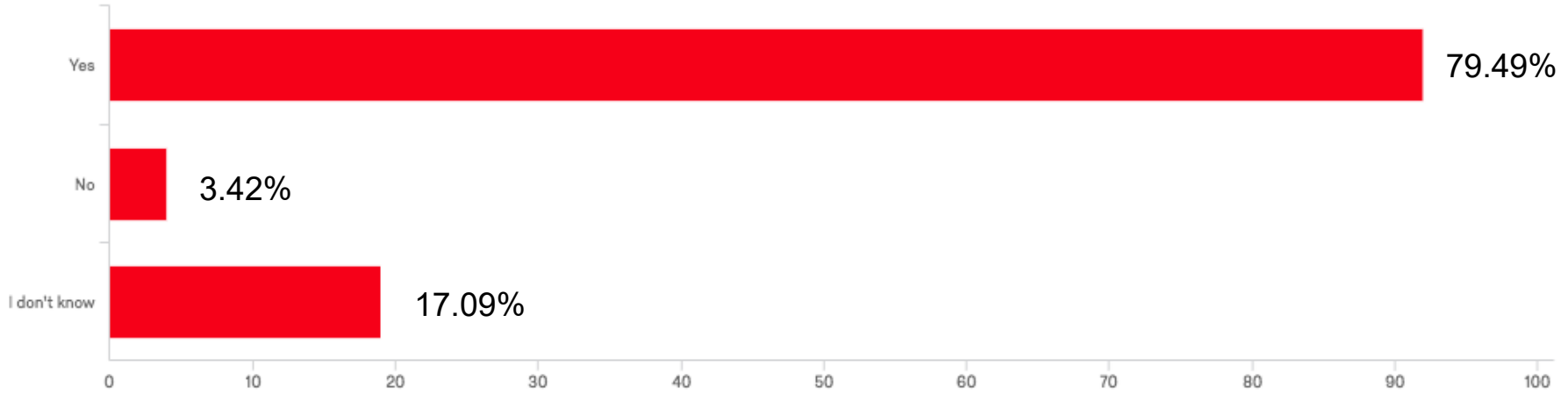



Where do you live?





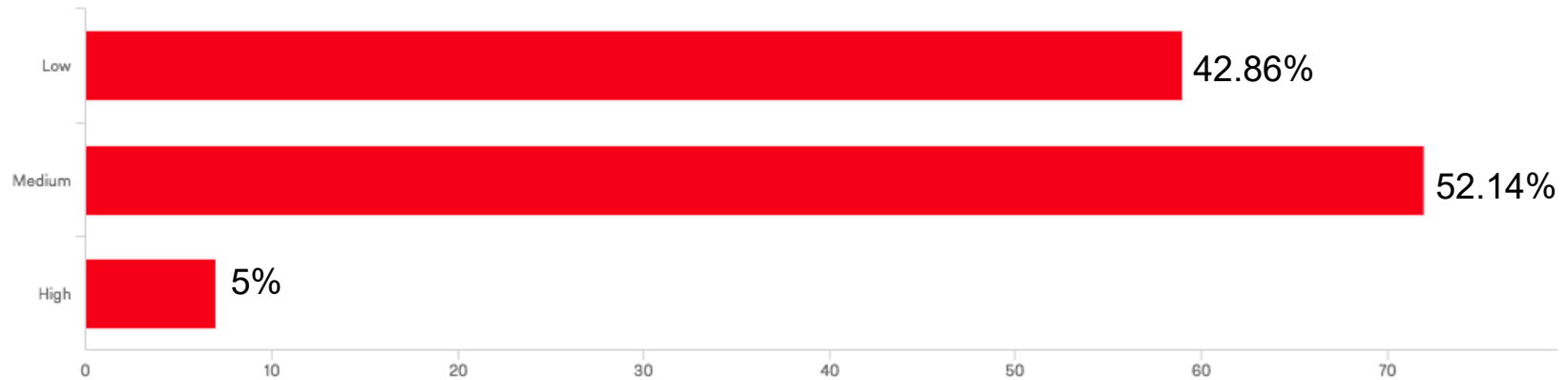
Do you believe Sex Trafficking Exists in your City/State?

 - Colorado- Both said yes

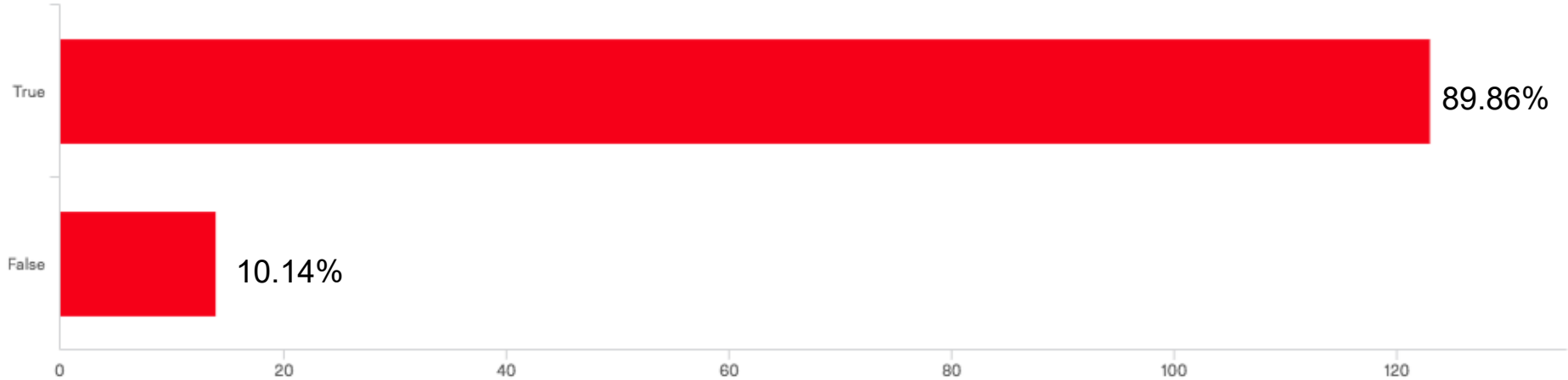


How would you rate your personal level of knowledge about sex trafficking?



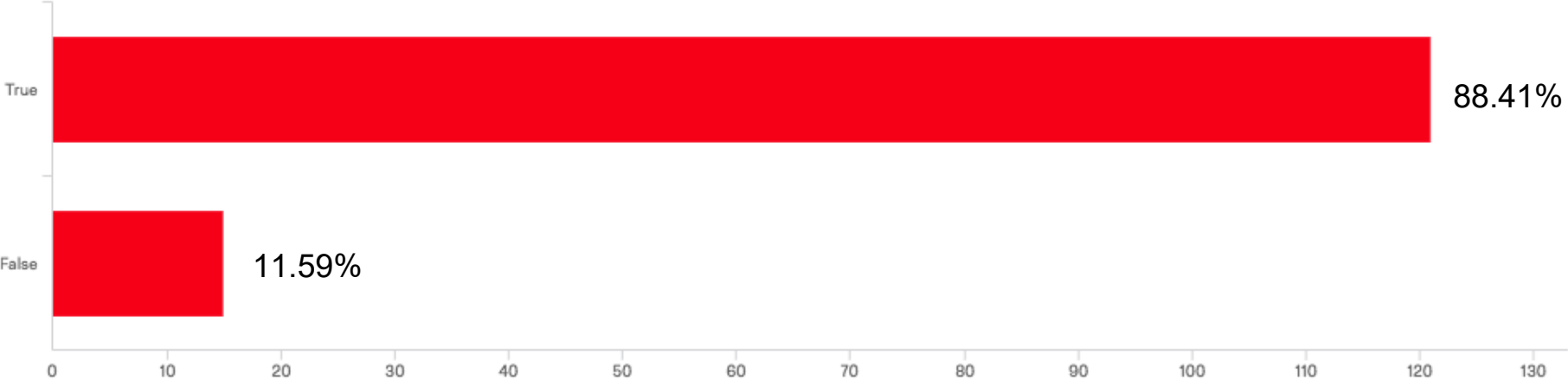


Children make up 26% of forced labor victims.



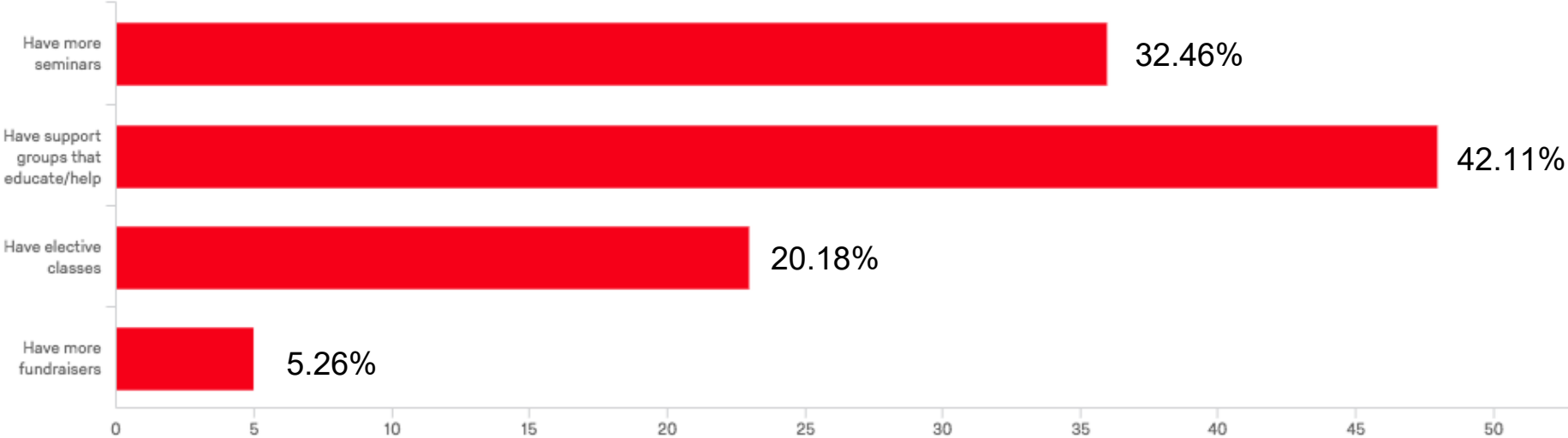


Sex trafficking is the third largest international crime
