METHODOLOGY

- WE USED A QUANTITATIVE RESEARCH APPROACH
- THE SURVEY WAS 20 QUESTIONS AND INCLUDED SKIP LOGIC, SO THE OFFICER'S ANSWERS WERE BASED ON THEIR EXPERIENCE AND KNOWLEDGE OF THE TOPIC
- THE SURVEY WAS ADMINISTERED USING QUALTRICS
- WE SENT THE SURVEY TO THE SEATTLE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND ASKED FOR THEM TO SEND THE LINK OUT TO THEIR ENTIRE POLICE DEPARTMENT.



The Survey Itself


- 20 QUESTIONS
- SENT TO THE SEATTLE POLICE DEPARTMENT ASKING ALL THEIR OFFICERS TO PARTICIPATE
- We ended up with 41 responses, it was unknown to us on how many officers it was sent to
- IN THE CONSENT FORM BEFORE THEY PROCEED WITH THE SURVEY, WE SAID THAT IT WOULD TAKE AN ESTIMATED 6 MINUTES TO COMPLETE IT.
- The survey was 18 and older
- Shortest time it took someone was 4 minutes meanwhile the longest was 44 minutes.





WE ESTIMATED THAT IT WOULD TAKE THEM AROUND 6 MINUTES TO COMPLETE THE SURVEY.

IT TOOK A MAJORITY OF THEM EXACTLY 6 MINUTES.



Issues Encountered When the Survey was Sent Out


- WE HAD A HARD TIME RECEIVING RESPONSES BACK ABOUT WHETHER OR NOT THE SURVEY HAD BEEN RECEIVED.
- WE WERE ONLY RECEIVING DAY TO DAY RESPONSES FROM THE OFFICERS SENDING OUT OUR SURVEY.
- DUE TO COVID-19 THE DEPARTMENT WAS VERY BUSY AND FLOODING IN WITH EMAILS, SO MANY OFFICERS COULD HAVE LOST OUR SURVEY WITHIN THEIR EMAILS COMING IN.
- Some officers didn't finish the survey due to some questions being "unanswerable."

Demographics Female: 7.3% 3 officers

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
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What are the ages of the Seattle Police Force?


The Youngest officer is 34 years old



ORGANIZATIONAL FACTORS THAT CONTRIBUTE TO POLICE DEADLY FORCE LIABILITY

This study focused specifically on police firearm use in deadly force situations, highlighting how managerial disorganization and administrative breakdown impacts departmental decision-making. Failure to train, policies, customs, and practices that caused constitutional

violations and injury.



Organizational leadership within the specific unit is critical in each police unit. Breakdown of leadership results in corruption of the unit and can be detrimental in the way officers are trained and equiped to handle threatening situations.





responses, and disparate reporting of rates of


force. Data varies from state to state.



Force which a reasonable person would consider likely to cause death or serious bodily harm. Its use may be justified only under conditions of extreme necessity, when all lesser means have failed or cannot reasonably be employed.

When necessary to protect oneself who reasonably believes himself or herself to be in imminent danger of death or serious bodily harm.

A civil rights violation wherein officers exercise undue or excessive force against a civilian. This includes, but is not limited too, physical or verbal harassment, physical or mental injury, property damage, and death.










Q5 - About How Many Hours Do You Estimate You Have Been Trained On Deadly Force?






Q6 - When Someone's Life Is At Risk What Is The First Action You Take?





Q7 - At What Point In An Altercation Does An Officer Have The Right To Use Deadly Force?




What Did We Hope To Get Out Of Questions 5-7?


- WE HOPED TO SEE THE OUTCOME OF THESE OFFICER'S 100+ HOURS OF TRAINING.





Conclusions based on the Seattle Police Department

- ALTHOUGH MOST OF THE OFFICERS KNEW THE DEFINITION OF "DEADLY FORCE" THERE WERE STILL A HANDFUL WHO DIDN'T
- THERE WERE FAR LESS FEMALES THEN MALES
- THERE ARE ONLY A FEW NEW OFFICERS IN THE DEPARTMENT, MOST HAVE BEEN ON THE FORCE FOR AN AVERAGE OF 20 YEARS!
- THERE ARE NOT VERY MANY YOUNG OFFICERS EITHER, THE YOUNGEST WAS 34
- Even though the officers have pulled their firearms many times, they rarely DISCHARGE IT

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
