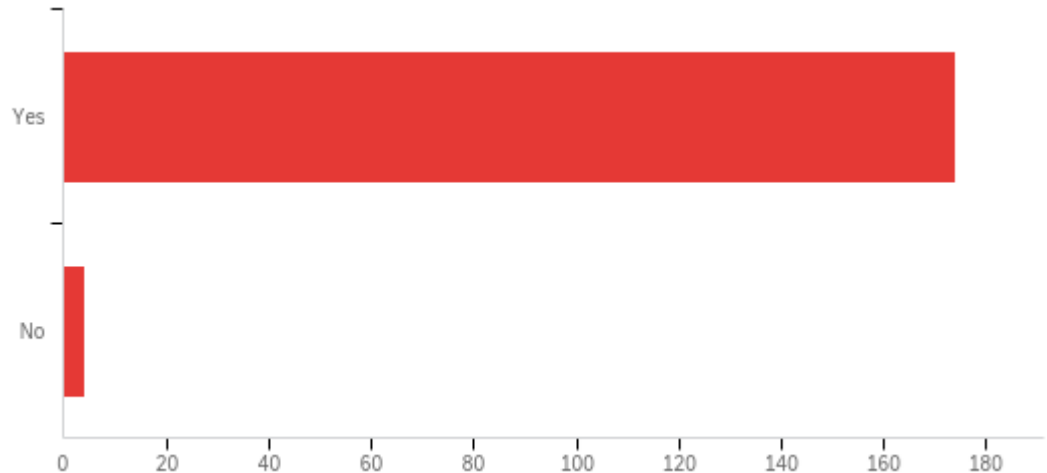

Sample Size

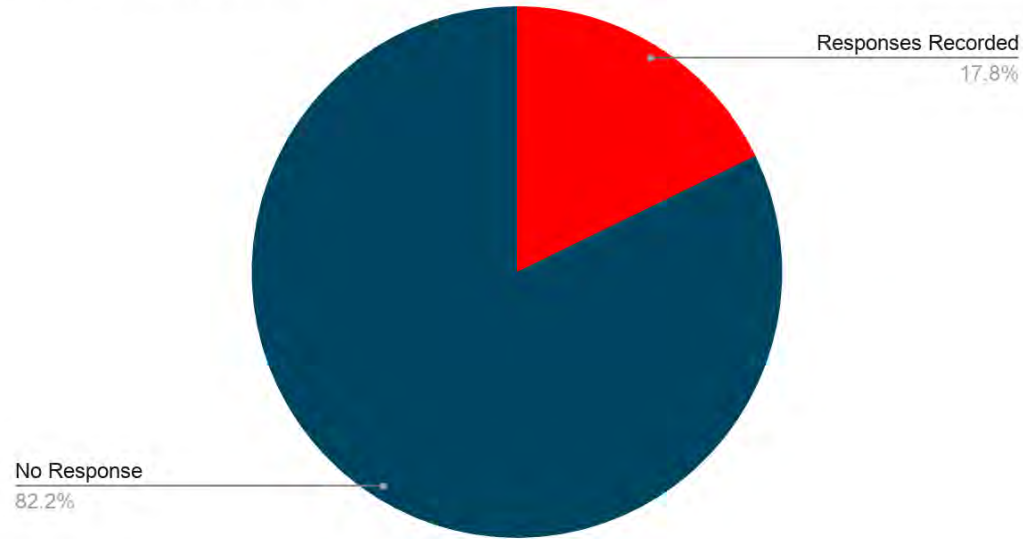
The survey was sent to 1000 students of UVU. Of the 1000 students 178 students responded to the survey. Of the 178 students 4 students did not consent to taking the survey.

 - 97.5% confidence level

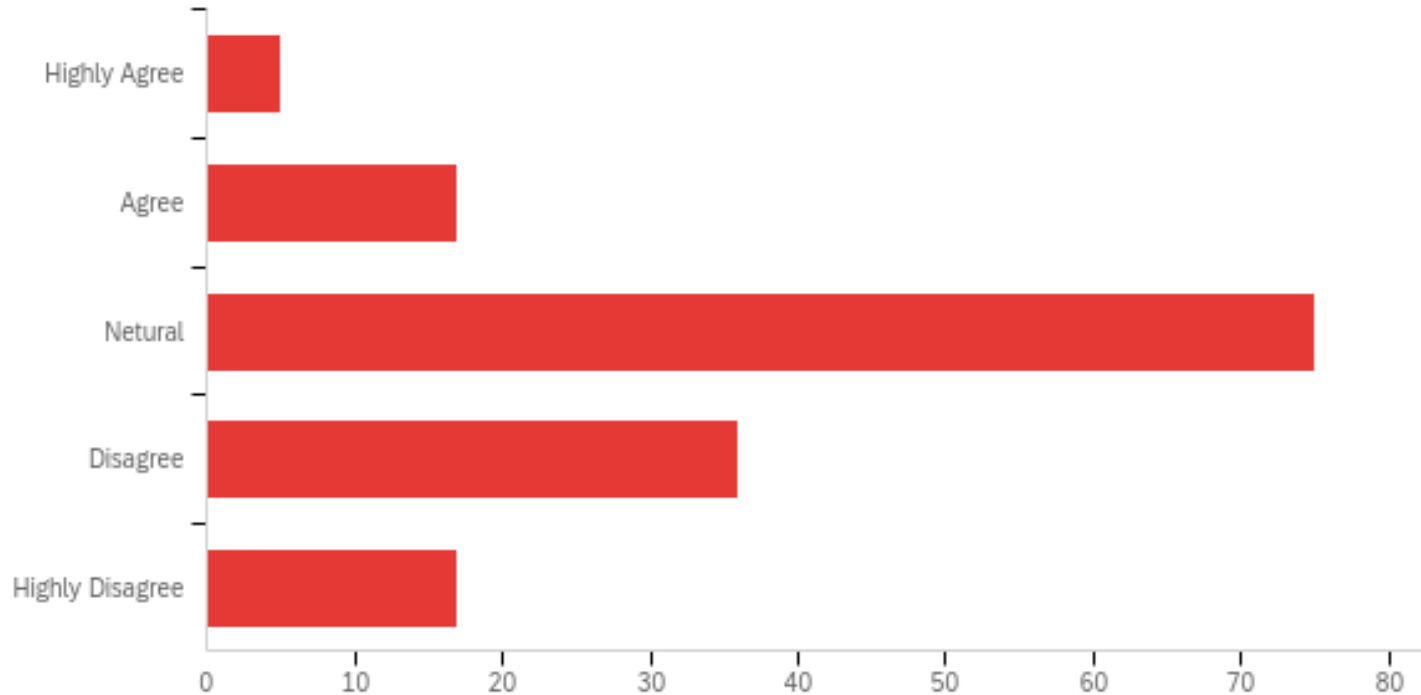
 - If all 1000 students took survey

- + Or - 4.99% interval

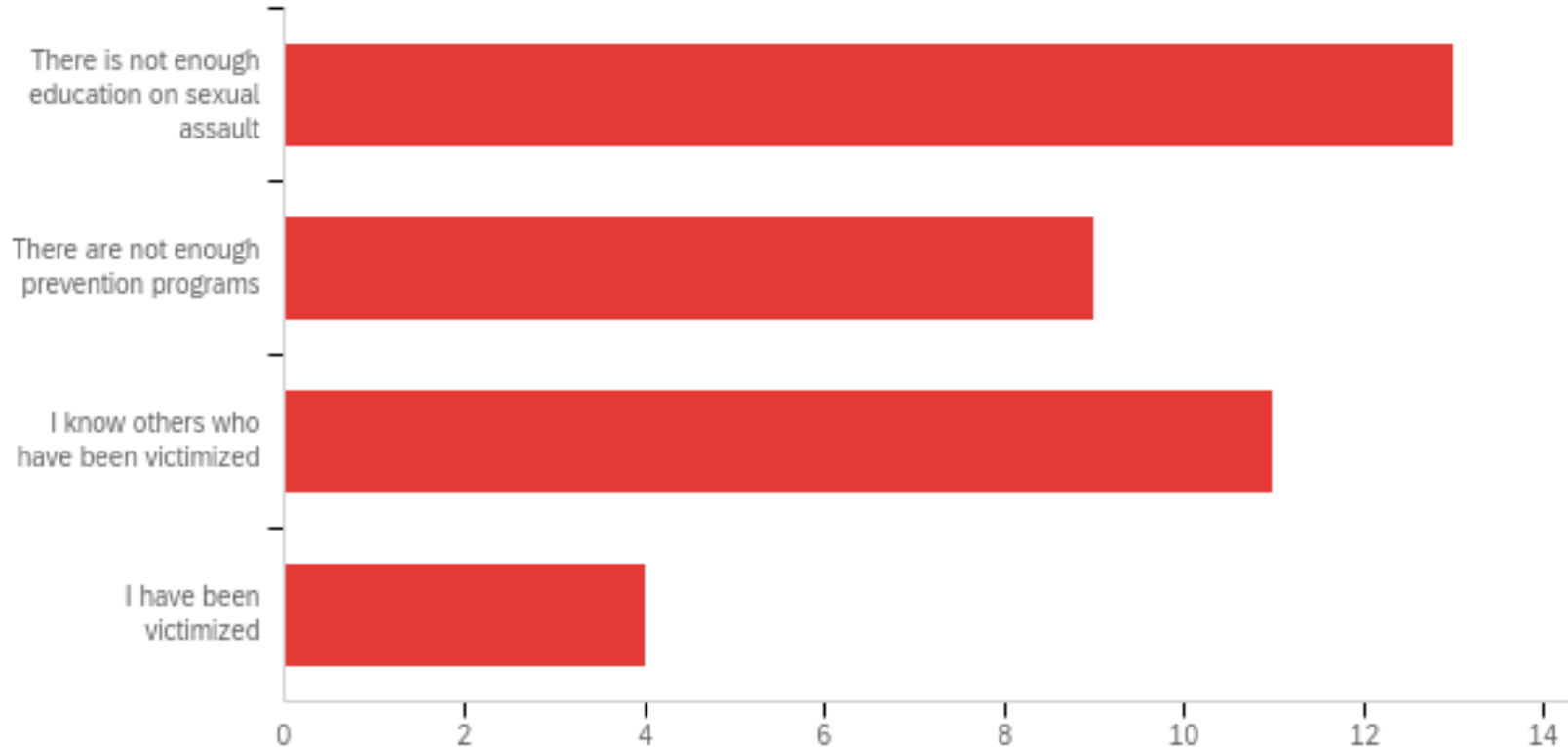
 - 81.5% confidence level

 - With our sample size of 178 responses

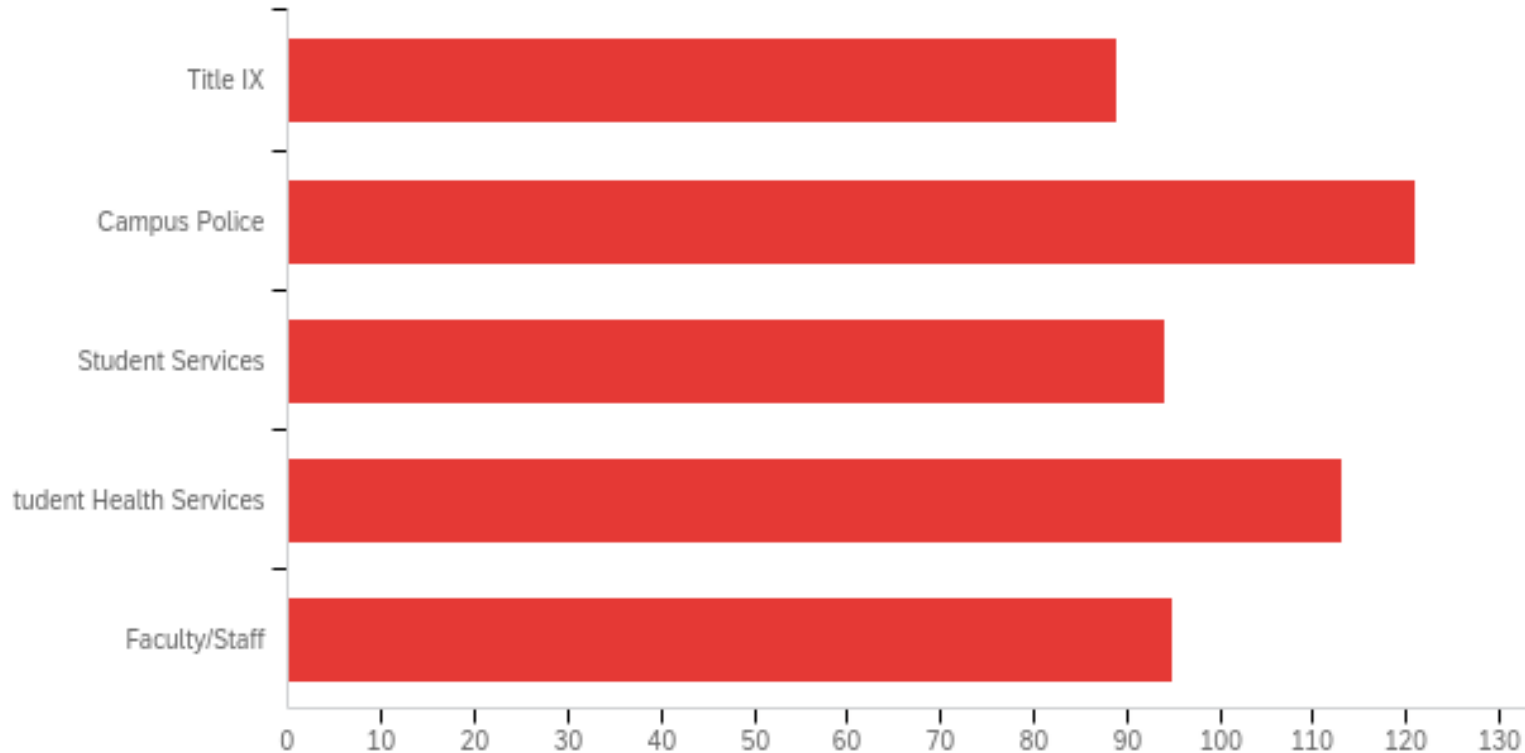
Do you feel that sexual assault is a problem here at UVU?



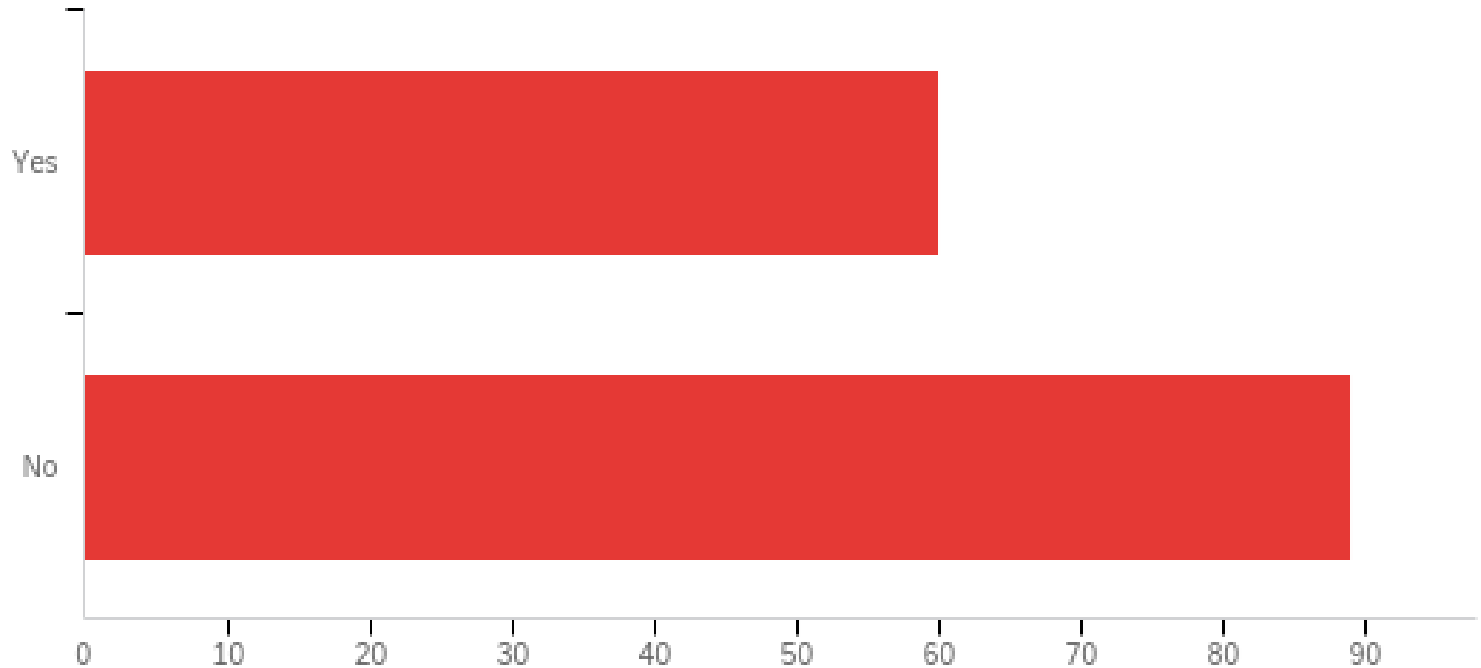
Why do students feel sexual assault at UVU is a problem?



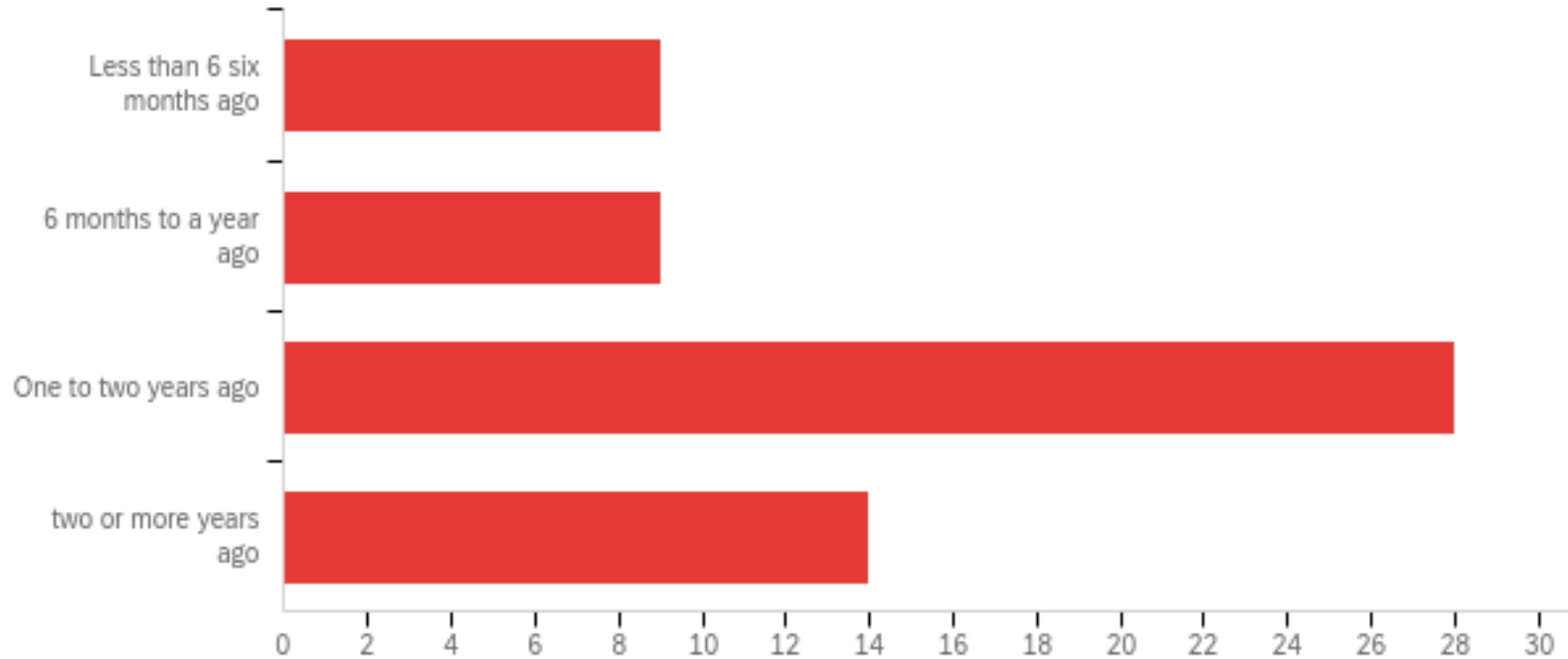
Do students know what can help victims of sexual assault at UVU?



Do students remember taking a sexual assault training while here at UVU?

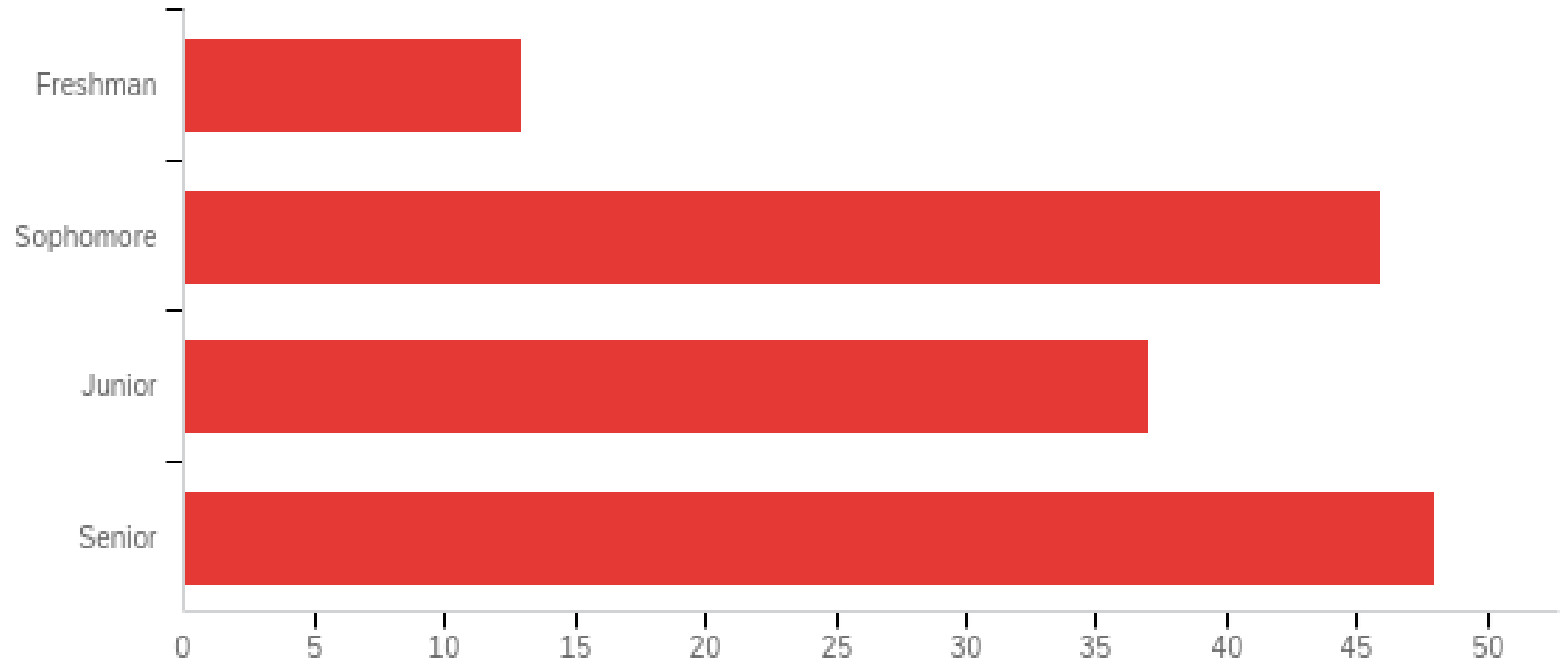


When did students take the UVU Sexual Assault Prevention Training?

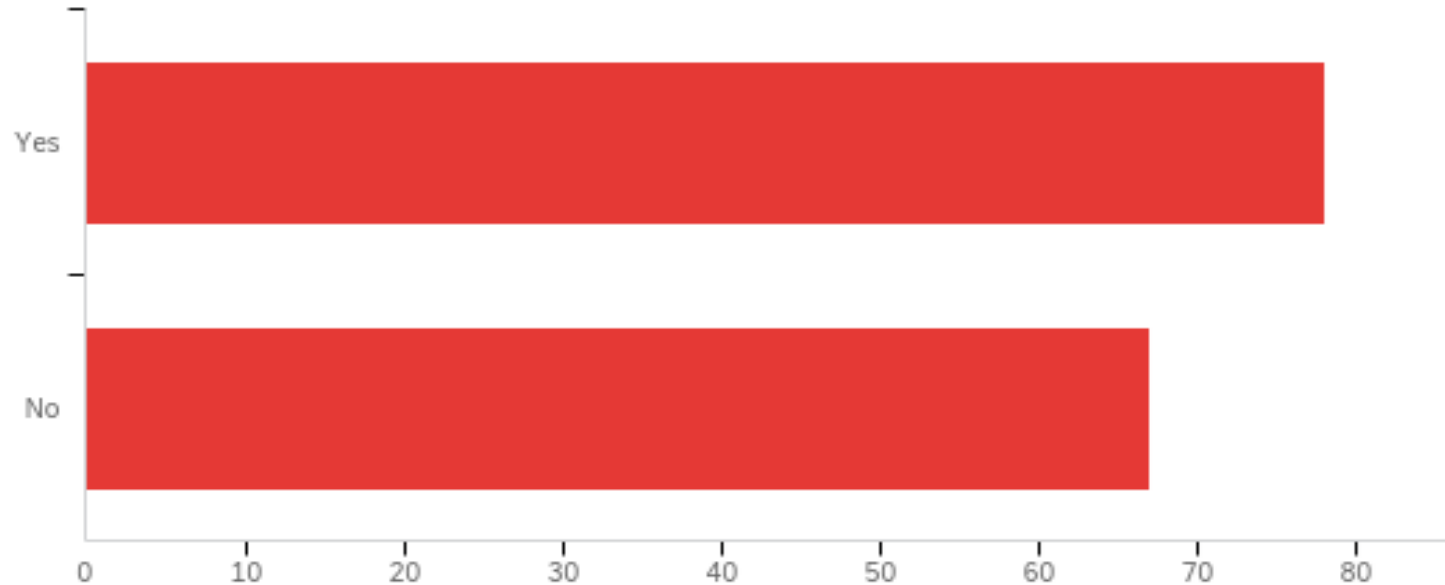




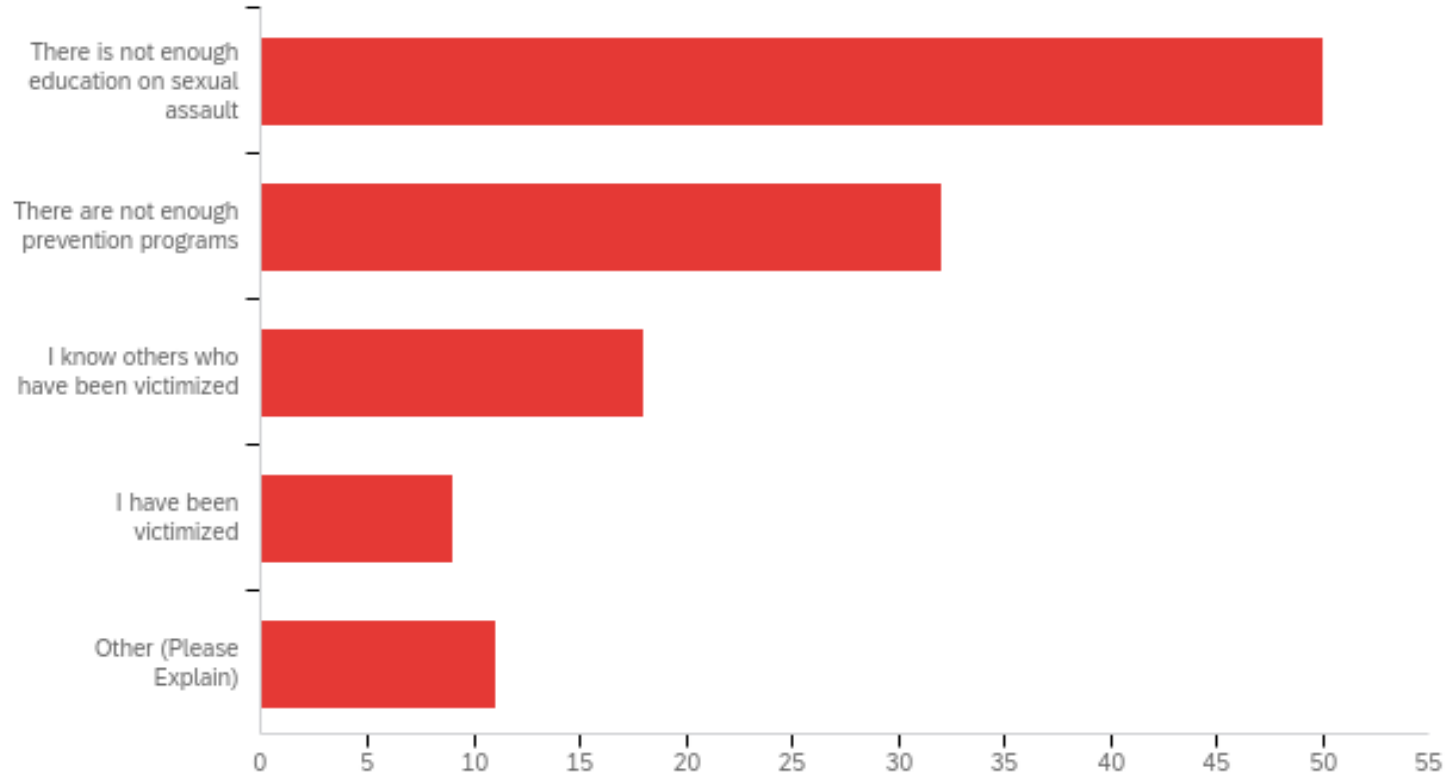
Academic Standings of Participants

Students reasons for needed better sexual assault programs

Didn't think it was serious enough: 61

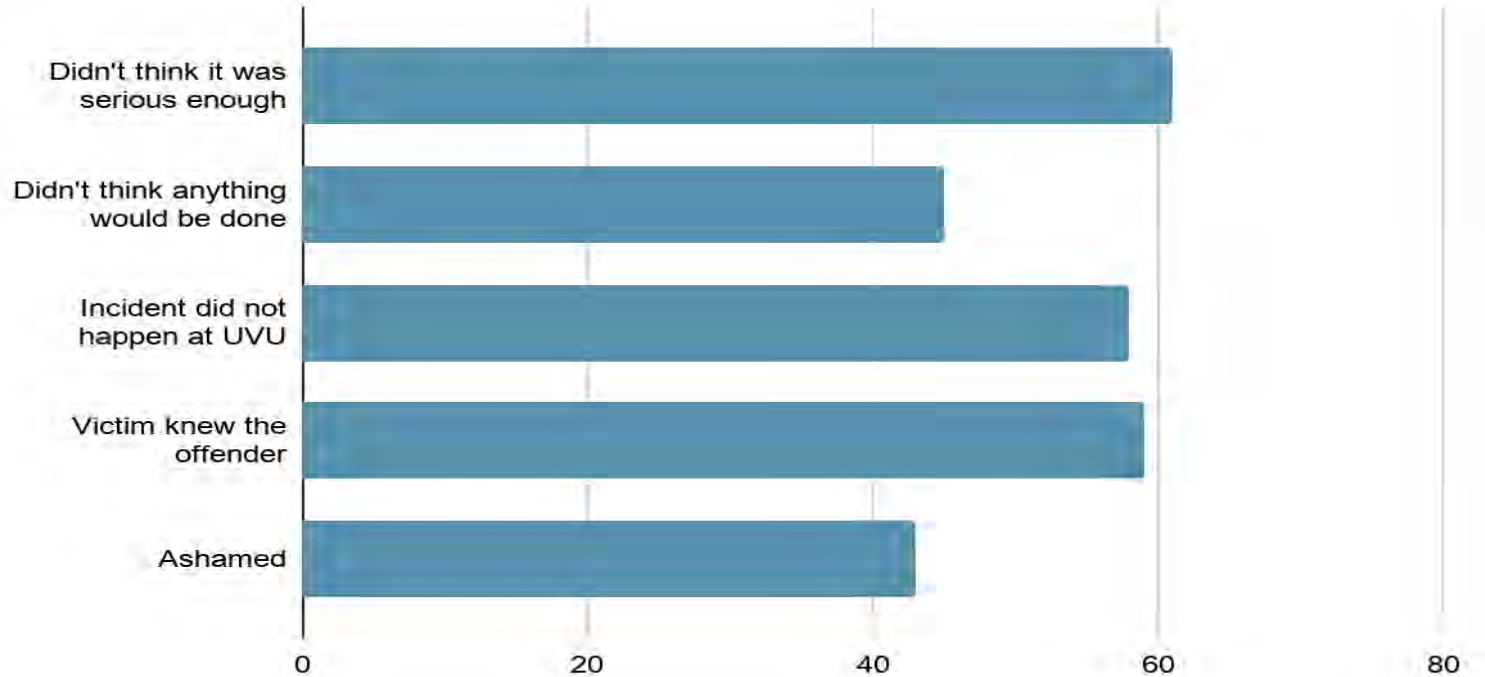
Didn't think anything would be done: 45

What are the most common reasons on why victims are not comfortable reporting?

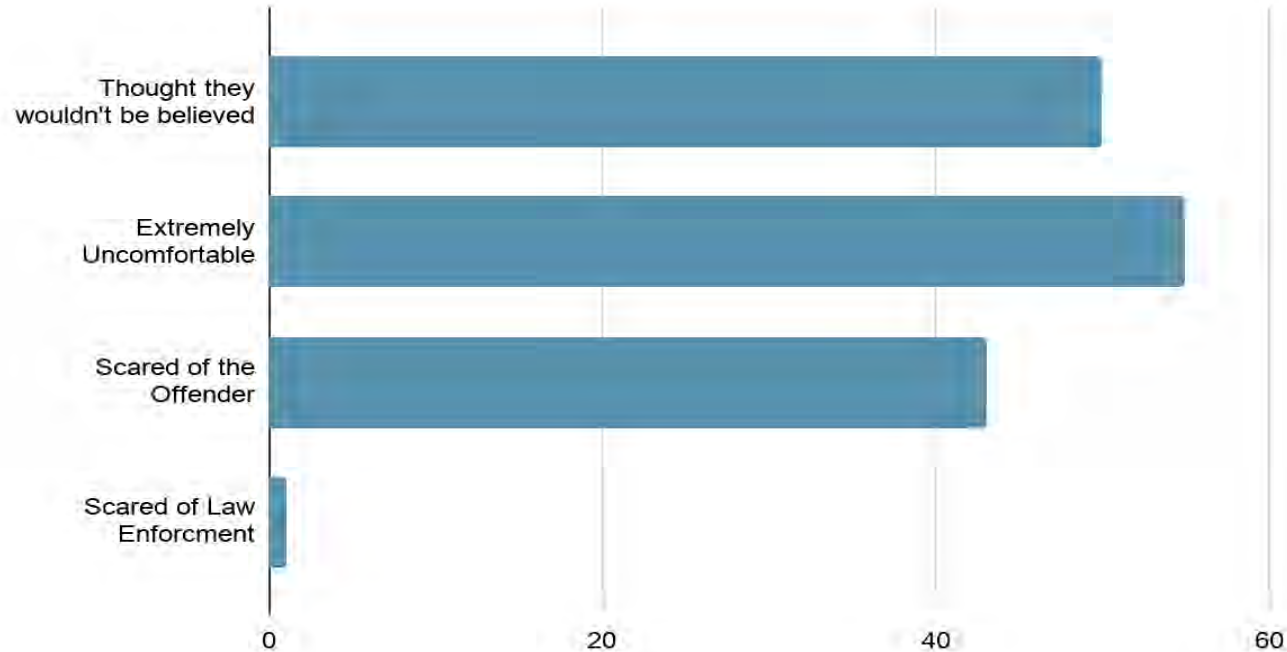
Thinking they wouldn't be believed: 50

The 3 most common perpetrators for sexual harassment are:

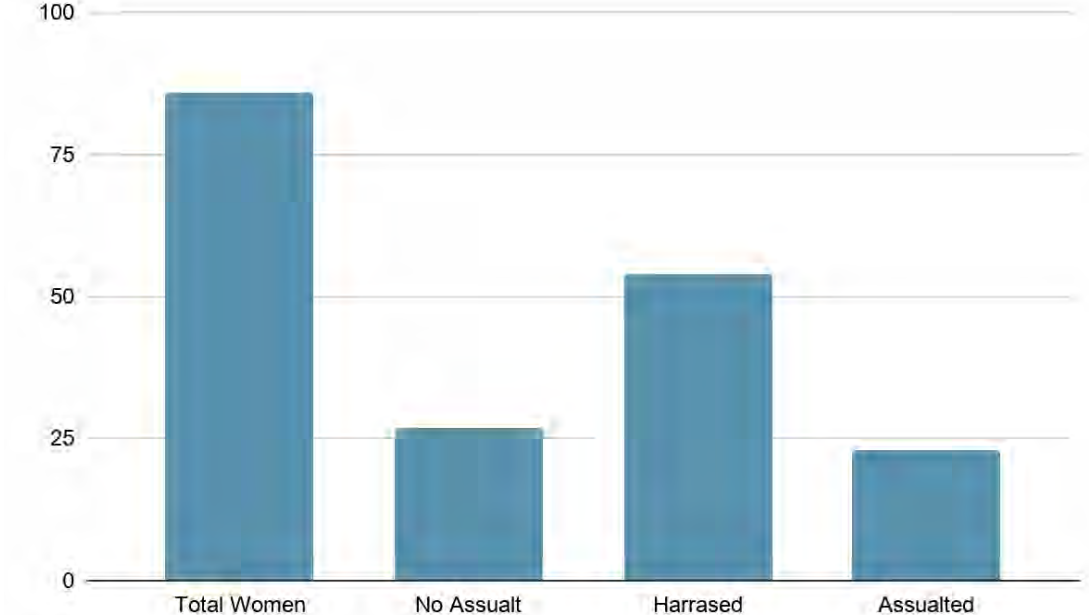
Friends, Close Relatives, and Significant Others.

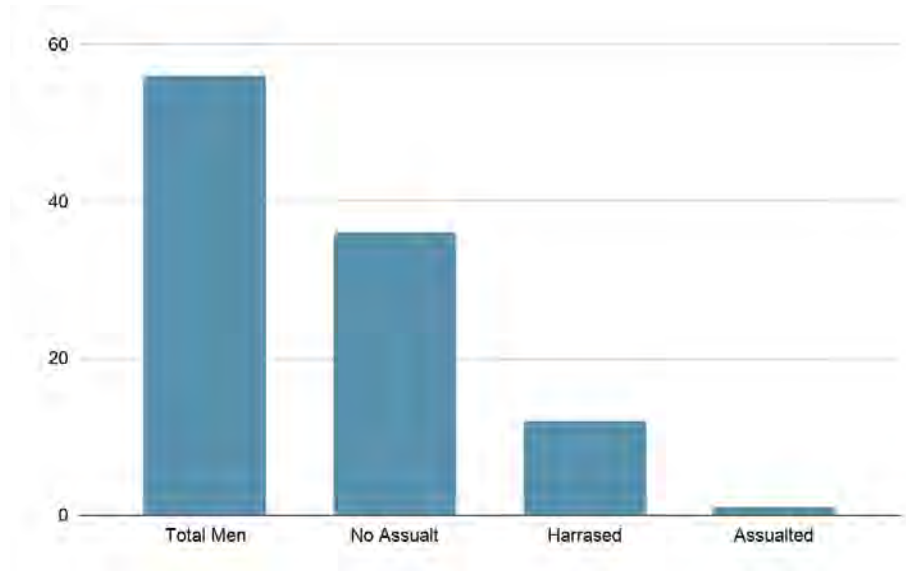
Women and Sexual Harassment & Assault

Out of 86 women who responded 27 report no sexual assault has been experienced. 23 women have experienced sexual assault in some form. Most women who were assaulted also have been sexually harassed with 19 of 23. Out of the 23 women 15 have been assaulted in more than 1 way.



Men and Sexual Harassment & Assault

Men had lower numbers for harassment and assault. 56 men participated in the survey. Of these men 12 had been sexually harassed with 1 man also being assaulted. With 42 reporting nothing having happened to them.



Other Genders and Sexual Harassment & Assault

4 individuals of a different gender than male or female took the survey. Of These 4 all had been sexually harassed with 2 being assaulted.

Final Conclusions

- Our survey backs up the claim that 1 in 5 Women will experience sexual assault
- Men get harassed and assaulted at a lower rate than women
- The main reason students did not report their sexual assault experience in this survey was because they did not think it was serious enough. Followed by the victim knew the offender.
- Another common reason why a victim did not report was due to being extremely uncomfortable and felt as if no one would believe them.

Final Conclusions

Most students have a neutral stance on sexual assault being a problem at UVU. However, of the students who do feel sexual assault is a problem believe there is not enough education being done. This is backed up by more than half of the survey responses who do not remember taking a prevention program during their time at UVU.
