

Faculty Mentor Senior Project Agreement (updated Spring 20)

*The first step of your Senior Project should be selecting your Faculty Mentor (from among the full-time faculty – currently Duane, Alex, Bill). This should be at “Idea” or “Draft” stage. Based on your pitch to them and their time schedule they will either agree or disagree to be your mentor. They will determine the expectations for a project proposal, how frequently you are expected to meet with them, and the final deliverables required. They will also give you your final grade in the Senior Projects classes. You are to collaborate with them on all aspects of your project for approval and suggestions... your senior project is not a chance for you to go off and make a movie without supervision or input (you can do that at any time). You must report your progress to them and include them on your call sheets and send them script drafts and edits. When your Faculty Mentor signs this form, he or she is agreeing to this role and it will be their responsibility to stay in contact with you and up to date on your project.*
