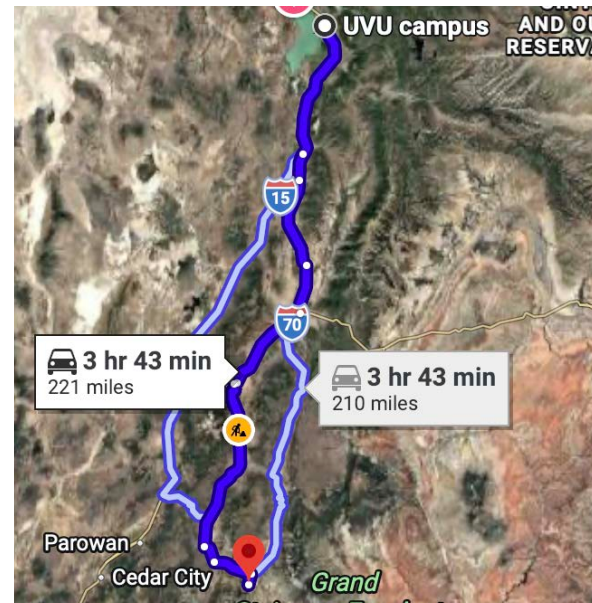

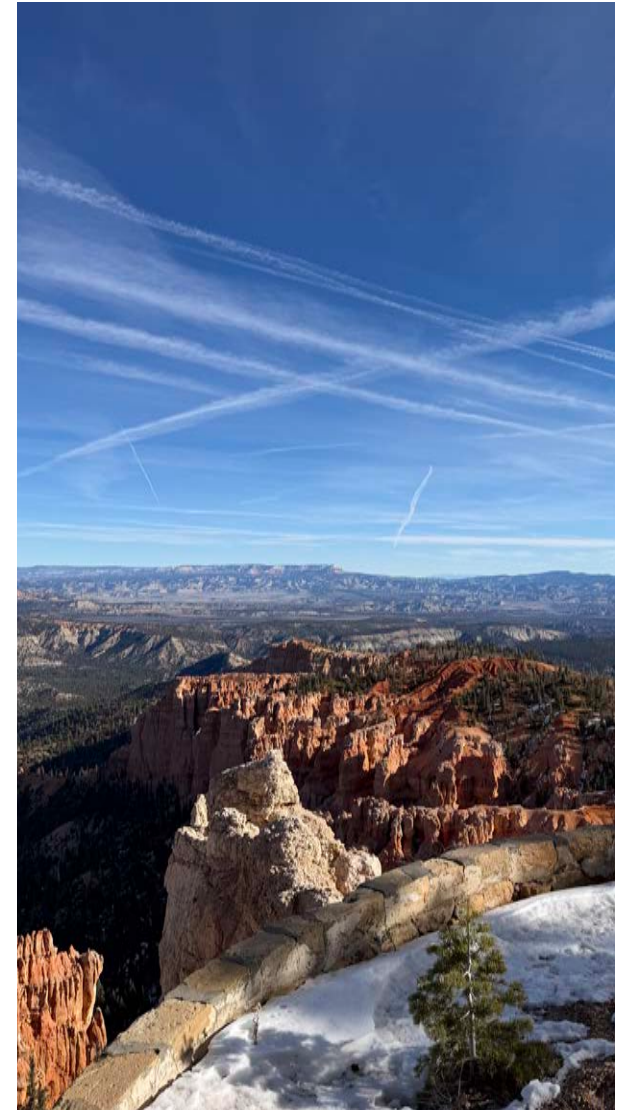

Content Safari: Bryce Canyon

October 9-11, 2026



Weather/Temperatures

Bryce Canyon is at 8,000ft elevation, which means colder temperatures than Utah County.

Day Time: Average high 50-70°

Night Time: Mid-20°

Emily and Dan will coordinate with the rangers to ensure that students are taken care of if the conditions get colder. Students should wear layers and prepare for early winter conditions.



Recommended Clothing

Students should plan on colder temperatures (not shorts weather). Avoid cotton layers against the skin, these are terrible insulators and if there's moisture, like sweat, you can't really stay warm. Merino wool is the best.

- 2-3x pairs of unmentionables
- 3x pairs of non-cotton socks
- 1x Long Johns/Long Underwear
- 1-2x Long Pants
- 1-2x Long Sleeve Shirt
- Puffy Coat
- Rain Jacket or Pancho
- Hiking Boots
- Campsite Shoes/Comfort Shoes
- Warm Gloves
- Baseball Cap or Brimmed Hat
- Beanie
- Sunglasses
- Toiletries/Medication

Emily's Personal Recommendations

- Fleece Lined Pants
- Water Resistant or Waterproof Boots
- Buff Neckwear



Camp Equipment

A warm sleeping bag is imperative so make sure you having a sleeping rated for 0° degree temperatures.

- 0° degree Sleeping Bag
- Sleeping Pad
- Extra Blanket
- Camp Mug (for hot cocoa)
- Flashlight/Headlamp
- Sunscreen
- Water Bottle

Nice-to-Have Camp Equipment

- Pillow
- Powerbank
- Chair
- Towel
- (Optional) Your Personal Tent
