Students can apply for formal admission to the post-Baccalaureate Licensing Program if they have previously completed a bachelor's degree in a compatible major from a regionally accredited institution. When all courses and requirements are successfully completed, students will be recommended to the Utah State Office of Education to receive a Secondary Teaching License, which enables them to teach their major grades 7-12.

Admission criteria include:

- 1) Proof of completed bachelor's degree for a regionally accredited institution.
- 2) Completion of a major compatible with one of UVU's Secondary Education programs (see advisor for details).
- 3) GPA of 3.0 or higher
- 4) "C" or better in all content area courses.
- 5) Passing the LiveScan criminal background check.

Application to the secondary education licensing program is a multi-level process separate from and in addition to admission to Utah Valley University. Meeting the minimum requirements only qualifies a student to be considered for admission and does not guarantee admission.
