Key Developments

Despite the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, the center successfully adapted to online programing and continued to provide content to students, faculty, and the general public. This prompted the center to shift its focus toward permanent online access and storage. With the easing of pandemic restrictions, we now offer fully integrated events with both in-person and live-stream options. This provides broad access and longevity through recordings that can be viewed anytime on our YouTube channel.

ETHICS ACROSS THE CURRICULUM

Ethics Center Student Fellow

The CSE supports student fellows to provide consultation, input, and leadership among students in ethics education projects. Fellows assist in the development of student-led projects, event preparation and publicity, undergraduate research, and the UVU Ethics Bowl Program.

Faculty Summer Seminar

Each June, faculty from across campus participate in a multi-day seminar designed to explore an interdisciplinary topic with a renowned visiting scholar. Participants may apply for funding to connect seminar content with one or more of their courses.

Faculty Fellows

The CSE supports three faculty fellows to provide leadership and support for our programs. At present, we have fellows to support student engagement, environmental ethics, and ethics across the curriculum.



ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY



The Center for the Study of Ethics has a longstanding tradition of supporting environmental ethics and related issues. For the past twenty-five years, we have hosted an annual Environmental Ethics Symposium to explore the complex relations between human beings and the natural world. We also partner with programs across campus in support of Sustainability Week, the UVU Environmental Studies Program, and the David R. Keller Prize in Sustainability.

Our work is closely connected to the campus-wide Interreligious Engagement Initiative designed to support academic research, student activities, and community outreach.
