Reinvestment Plan Update

- Emphasis on urgency as the University has 6 weeks to submit recommendations to USHE
 - Highlighted the progress made in evaluating programs based on:
 - Enrollment
 - Completion rates
 - Professional outcomes
 - Workforce demands
 - Instructional costs
 - Stressed importance of faculty and staff involvement in the evaluation process, ensuring that decisions are made transparently and with input from those directly affected by the changes.
 - Link to provide anonymous feedback on the draft documents is open until May 28th

- Not all flagged programs will be discontinued; some programs might be reorganized or adjusted rather than eliminated
 - Clarified that discontinuing a program does not necessarily mean the
 associated classes will no longer be offered. Explained that faculty members
 would still teach the classes if they serve other programs, and a two-year
 teach-out period would be followed.
