Academic Calendar, Tiffany Evans

[3:25-3:50]

- Presented the Academic Calendar Committee's recommendations, including moving Spring break one week later starting in 2027
- Efforts to balance instructional days, and ongoing challenges with aligning the calendar with local school districts
- Final exam scheduling concerns were raised; faculty recommended to contact the academic scheduling office and ongoing discussions about revising the scheduling algorithm
- Discussed the impact of the academic calendar on student housing, especially for those graduating in winter or spring

New Syllabus Submission Process

[3:50-3:55]

- Updates given on the implementation of Simple Syllabus for required courses, discussed technical issues, and clarified that state law and USHE policy requirements for syllabus posting, including ongoing discussions about due dates and faculty privacy
- Clarified that only courses with no substitutions in a program (e.g. Ethics and Values) are considered required and must be uploaded, while courses with alternatives do not need to be posted unless the institution decides otherwise

Communication Concerns

- New security measures, including the use of metal detectors at convocations and commencement, clarified that while costs will be absorbed by the university through the end of the year, individual departments may need to cover these costs in the future
- Ongoing concerns regarding communication and accountability from administration following the campus shooting were raised, including the lack of direct engagement from the Provost and President, and efforts to improve messaging and close feedback loops
- o Encouraged continued use of feedback forms and professional, constructive comments
