Ambassador-at-Large from Haiti

Dr. Rudolph “Rudy” Moise was appointed as Ambassador-at-Large for the Republic of Haiti in April 2014 by President Michel Martelly. He was born in Port-au-Prince, Haiti and moved to the United States at age 17. Ambassador Moise believed that in the United States he could find great opportunity and dedicated himself to learning English and completing his high school education.

Dr. Moise continued his studies and went on to earn a Doctorate degree in Osteopathy from the Chicago College of Osteopathic Medicine, a Master of Business Administration from the University of Miami, and a Juris Doctor from the University of Miami School of Law. Dr. Moise holds a Flight Surgeon Degree from the US Air Force School of Aerospace Medicine and served as a Lieutenant Colonel in the US Air Force Reserve.

He has enjoyed successful careers in several fields, working as a primary care physician, an attorney, an entrepreneur, an Air Force Officer, and an actor. Since 1984, He has been the

President and Medical Director of Comprehensive Health Center in North Miami. He also serves on the Board of Directors of United Way of Miami-Dade, as CEO of Physicians Access Urgent Care Group, Vice President of Access Healthcare, and as founder and president of the Kenbe Foundation.

Because of his dedication, hard work, and remarkable accomplishments, Ambassador Moise was uniquely prepared to help after the catastrophic earthquake of January 12, 2010. He traveled to Haiti with a disaster rescue team where he helped pull people from the rubble and administered medical care, saving many lives. He continued his work long after the initial rescue period, collecting and shipping more than 300,000 donated items to Haiti. His work as an Ambassador is a continuation of this service to his home country.
