

International Travel Highlights

Dr. Andrew Goodman- Marrakech, Morocco

In November 2022, Dr. Andrew Goodman, assistant professor of elementary education, traveled to Marrakech, Morocco. Working with a small team of scholars from Arizona State University and the Nevada Department of Education, Dr. Goodman led multiple sessions of professional development with Moroccan faculty aimed at strengthening course learning objectives, quality assessment design, and development of aligned rubrics. He also supported his colleagues in their work with faculty on planning active, engaging learning experiences, flipped learning development, and learner accessibility. This on-going work is a result of a USAID partnership with Morocco's Ministry of Education (through Arizona State University), designed as a sustainable approach to strengthen the capacity of Moroccan faculty as they create and plan for digital integration in teaching and learning.







Dr. Moh El Saidi- Antalya, Turkey

In November 2022, Dr. Moh El Saidi, Professor of Statistics, traveled to Antalya, Turkey to present his research findings at the 6th International Symposium of Researchers, Statisticians, and Young Statisticians. The paper, co-authored by Dr. Lynn Adams entitled "Modality Demand Trends and Student's Preferences Post COVID in a Public University," investigates the effect that Covid-19 had on student demand for specific educational modalities including Face-to-Face, Hybrid, Independent Study, Internship, Live Interactive Video, and Online in the Woodbury School of Business at Utah Valley University. The aim of the symposium was to bring together national and international academics, researchers, undergraduates, and graduate students dedicated to Statistics and other related fields. Participants were able to present their work and share scientific research, innovative ideas, and application results with the scientific world.
