

This is our fifth year of this valuable community collaboration, which is designed to educate new Dual Language Immersion teachers and addresses all the first and second-year competencies outlined in the DLI Professional Trajectory as essential skills. Over 1,200 teachers across the seven DLI languages (Chinese, French, German, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, and English) participated across the five-day institute.

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Ukraine

The Office for Global Engagement facilitated a Memorandum of Understanding agreement last month. The following day, UVU signed an MOU with the University of Khmelnytsky Humanitarian and Pedagogical Academy (KGPA) in Ukraine. This agreement will benefit the UVU Departments of Psychology, Social Work, and English & Literature.

UVU College of Science – Peru / Bolivia Collaboration

On August 19, representatives from Utah, Peru, and Bolivia discussed research possibilities and proposals regarding Utah Lake and Lake Titicaca in a meeting arranged by the Office for Global Engagement. Topics included algae harvesting, nutrient loading, pesticide impact assessments, and public awareness initiatives, among others. This meeting was also conducted in both English and Spanish, with live audio translation made possible through Utah-based US Translation.



UVU Music Department Program in Bulgaria

In July 2024, Dr. Cheung Chau, director of the UVU Orchestra, led a delegation of UVU student musicians to Bulgaria. Each year, a limited number of young musicians are invited for an intensive summer program put on by the International Musicians Academy. This year, twelve current and former UVU students participated in the festival.

Wolverines Around the World

📍 New Zealand and Tonga

Professor Mike Patch recently had the opportunity to take 18 education students to New Zealand and Tonga for two weeks to be exposed to different cultural experiences both in education as well as regular life. In New Zealand, the students got to spend significant time in Māori immersion schools, where they rotated classrooms and experience teaching for full days there. In addition, Professor Patch and his students saw New Zealand, where they took part in traditional life and culture. After New Zealand, the group flew to Tonga, where they were able to teach, observe, and interact with students in the Tongan schools. They explored Tonga as well, visiting sites such as Captain Cook's landing spot and going snorkeling and cliff-jumping. It was a wonderful experience for the students to see and learn from different education systems. As Professor Patch put it, "it changes how we see ourselves and how we see ourselves as global citizens rather than just being safe in our home default culture"—an experience that can change both personal and world views.



Updated International Travel Guidelines

- UVU Policy 252 states that all requests for travel (Concur) must reach the Office for Global Engagement one month (4 weeks) before departure.
- Any travel (Concur) request that reaches Global Engagement less than 4 weeks before the departure date will be subject to a \$100 late fee. This late fee will be charged to the banner index used for the international travel insurance.
- Any travel (Concur) request that reaches Global Engagement 10 days or less than the travel date, travel will not be approved until additional review has been performed by Global Engagement.
