About the Herbert Institute

On March 31, 2022, the UVU Board of Trustees approved the Gary R. Herbert Institute for Public Policy as an academic unit, allowing students, faculty, and the community to engage with public policy leaders in a way that had not happened before at Utah Valley University.

Regardless of political affiliation, background, or position, the Institute invites and welcomes leaders to gather, connect, and engage in civil discourse about political policy to instill trust in the institutions that have made our country great. Truly, the Herbert Institute will make UVU and our community a better place.

The Institute is supported by three pillars: Lead, Gather, and Trust.

LEAD

The Herbert Institute develops future policy leaders by engaging students and the community in current public policy issues, directing high-impact internships, and promoting community engagement in the political process.

Herbert Legislative Interns

The Herbert Institute works with UVU's High Impact Internship program to hire and place students in opportunities where they will gain powerful experiences serving at the state and national level. In 2022, the inaugural cohort of 27 Herbert interns had the opportunity to see how policymaking works from the inside out.

Fifteen of those interns had the privilege of serving during the 2022 Utah Legislature General Session, joining a group of 100 Utah college students. Each student was assigned to a Utah legislator and served as their only staff resource during the 45-day session. This provided them an excellent opportunity to make personal connections with their legislator and others serving our state. They were able to meet some of the biggest names in Utah politics, personally observe the lawmaking process, and earn university credit.

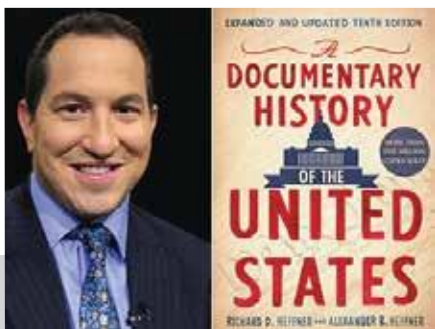

The Herbert Institute builds and enhances trust in the principles and civic institutions that are the foundation of our democratic republic in the United States of America.

Research Projects

The Herbert Institute is conducting a series of research projects, which currently fall under two major policy areas: nature conservation and elections.

The Conservation Project began in 2022 and will continue for the next three years. The Herbert Institute has received funding from Sportsmen for Fish and Wildlife and the Utah Department of Natural Resources to review current conservation practices. The first of two research papers analyzed the impact Utah's drought had on mule deer populations. The second paper is a primer on the state's approach to conservation policy over the past three decades, which provides introductory research for future conservation studies. These two papers are nearing completion and will be shared in Summer 2023. Spring 2023 conservation research will focus on species population data for Utah's ten most important species for fishing and hunting.

The Herbert Institute will begin work evaluating Utah's elections to determine if voters who want to vote have access to ballots and if ballots, once cast, are secure. We will also research various election policy options. The first project on Utah's elections explored Utah experiment with ranked choice voting: how it works, what benefits it provides, and some of the issues cities have had with implementation.
