The Li Ka-Shing Foundation Scholarship financially assists UVU students who are completing international and/or high impact internships. Students who wish to apply must meet the following criteria:

1. UVU Student
  - a. Student must be a current UVU undergraduate at time of internship and registered for a least 1 internship credit during their internship semester
2. Needs-Based
  - a. Student must show assistance is needed to enable the internship
  - b. Student must show that scholarship funding will help the student avoid incurring additional debt
3. Prestigious Nature of the Internship- Student's internship must meet one or more of the following:
  - a. Industry leader (brand recognition)
  - b. National, international, or global impact
  - c. Size of organization (>100 employees)
4. Academic Rigor
  - a. Student must have a 3.0 minimum GPA
  - b. Students with a 3.2 GPA and above is preferred
5. Relevancy to Career Path
  - a. Student must show a direct correlation between their internship, their major, and their career path
6. Comprehension and Application of the Li Ka-Shing Foundation's Mission and Focus
  - a. Student must show knowledge and understanding of the Li Ka-Shing Foundation's mission statement and focus
  - b. Student demonstrates a commitment to the Li Ka-Shing Foundation's values through prior experiences and achievements

- Responses to essay questions

Essay Questions

Instructions

The internship scholarship essay questions will give you an opportunity to explain your internship, leadership experience, community service and future goals to the Internship Scholarship Committee. Part of the judging will be based on the professionalism of your application.

Guidelines:

- Responses must be typed. Include your full name at the top of each page.
  - Include the full question to which you are responding.
  - Each response is to be at least one paragraph, no more than 200 words in length.
  - Your essay should be clear, concise, and professional.

International Internship Scholarship Essay Questions

1. Describe your internship (Please address the following questions in your response):

How did you find your internship?

- Describe the job responsibilities you will have during the internship.
- How many hours a week will you work during the internship?
- What do you hope to learn from this experience?

2. How does this internship fit into your future career plans?

3. Explain your academic progress and achievements.

4. The Li Ka-Shing Foundation's mission states: "Our commitment to education is long term. We see education as the basis for the advancement of human civilization and technology, as well as the welfare and prosperity of society...We believe that education is the cornerstone of creative, caring, and technically inclined society." How has getting a college education impacted your life?

5. One of the three main focuses of the Li Ka-Shing Foundation is to encourage a culture of giving, what have you done in your own circle of influence to encourage a culture of giving? Explain how this has effected how you see the world.

6. Li Ka-Shing said, "Your dedication should not be confined for your own gain, but unleash your passion for your beloved country as well as for the integrity and humanity of mankind." What does this quote mean to you?
