Admission Requirements

- Verification of a bachelor's degree from accredited institution
- A cumulative minimum 3.0 GPA or 3.0 for the last 60 credits
- Completed graduate application and admissions essay
- 3 professional references who will provide recommendation
- Minimum 1 year working in a K-12 setting preferred
- A successful interview with the SOE Graduate Committee

Graduation Requirements

- Complete all courses with a grade of B- or higher
- Complete all program hours (48)
- Maintain an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Complete courses and projects within five years
- Complete all practicum and internship requirements set by UVU and USBE

Licensure

Successful graduates who pass the Praxis with the required qualifying score will be eligible for professional licensure as a school counselor in the state of Utah.
