Admission Requirements

- Verification of a bachelor’s degree from an accredited institution in a content area for which UVU can recommend a secondary teaching license
- A grade of C or higher for all coursework required by USBE, and minimum 3.0 GPA for the last 60 credits of undergraduate coursework
- Three professional references who will provide recommendations through the application portal
- Submission of complete graduate application and essay
- A successful interview with the SOE Graduate Committee
- A successful background check through the USBE

Continuance and Graduation Requirements

- Complete all courses with a grade of B- or higher
- Maintain an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher
- A minimum of 20 graduate credit hours must be completed in the graduate program.
- Complete courses and project requirements within six years
- Graduate credits accepted from another regionally accredited institution shall have been completed within four years of matriculation into the graduate program and cannot be older than six years at the time of graduation with a master’s degree.
