

# **BSN Completion Program (RN-BSN)**

### for applicants already licensed as Registered Nurses as of Fall 2018

All BSN nursing classes are offered face to face or online. Classes can be taken in any order, and students can attend full or part time. Students must meet both the UVU requirements and the Department of Nursing requirements to qualify for graduation. **Prerequisite Requirements**: All prerequisites must be completed <u>before</u> applying to the program. A final grade of a C or higher is required in all classes except Quantative Literacy (QL).

- Upper Division Credits: A minimum of 40 upper division credit hours are required to graduate.

Courses numbered 3000 or higher are considered upper division credits. BSN credits alone will not satisfy this requirement.

**Non-Nursing BSN Degree Requirements:** These classes can be taken prior to entry in the program. Final grade of C or higher is required.

#### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

#### \*APPROVED NURSING ELECTIVE HOURS: 5 Credits

The BSN degree requires 5 credit hours of approved Nursing Elective credit hours.

All or at least 2 credit hours of the required 5 Nursing Elective credit hours must be upper division nursing classes from the Approved Nursing Elective Classes List. If needed, other Nursing Elective credit hours may be taken from the Approved Non-Nursing Classes List.

NURS 490R Special Topics in Nursing - limit of 4 credit hours can be applied toward elective hours.

NURS 495R Independent Study in Nursing - limit of 3 credit hours can be applied toward elective hours.

#### NURS 4540 Research & Theory in Nursing Practice

Prerequisite of a univeristy-level statistics course with a C grade or higher.

#### NURS 4325 Nursing in the Community Clinical

This class must be taken concurrently with NURS 4320.

NURS 4325 Nursing in the Community Clinical requires 45 hours of community service which may include working in a community-based nursing setting, engaging in a community teaching project, and providing community service of the student's choice with instructor approval.

These clinical hours must be completed while registered for NURS 4320 & 4325, not before or after.

Clinical faculty members responsible for the course will make arrangements for clinical assignments for students. Specific details about the clinical hours needed and any questions regarding the NURS 4325 clinical course requirements should be directed to the clinical faculty responsible for the course.

Until matriculated in the BSN completion program, all requirements are subject to change without notice or obligation. BSN completion program classes can be taken in any order, full or part-time, and face to face or online.

A grade of C or better is required in each class.

Responsibility for statisfying all requirements rests upon the student.

Students should use Wolverine Track to monitor their graduation requirements.

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
