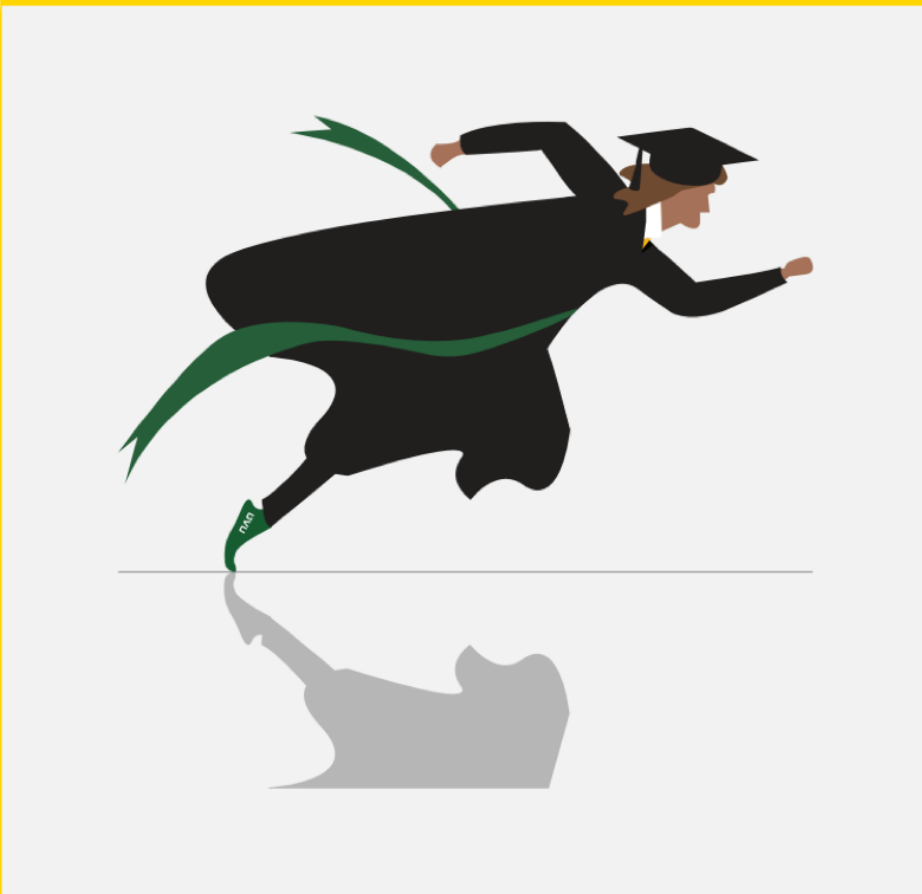

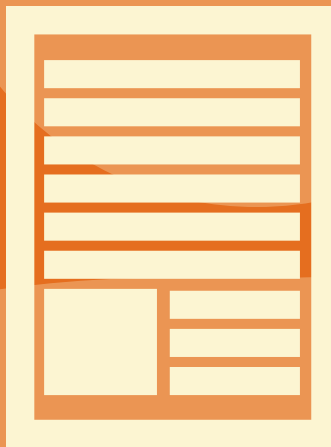
UVU's Civitas system shows higher persistence and credit load for students who mix face-to-face and online courses

At USU, regardless of academic performance, economic environment, or race, students who took 15 credits were more likely to persist term-to-term than students who took fewer than 15. In fact, they were half as likely to leave USU without a degree.

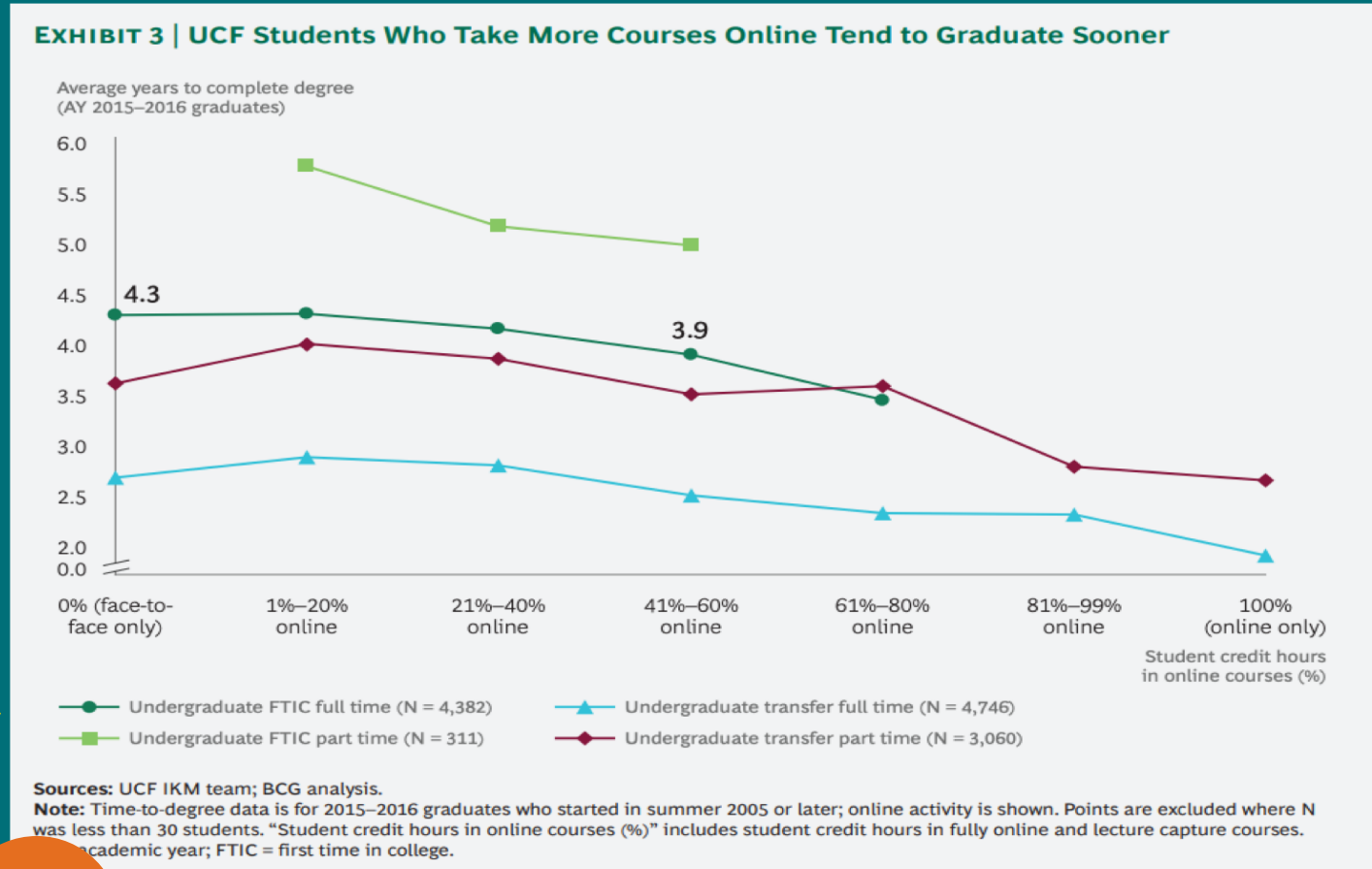
