The First Semester Certificate in Criminal Justice is your first step toward pursuing a degree in Criminal Justice. The program focuses on the foundational skills used in the criminal justice field. Successfully completing courses can lead to other degree goals and employment opportunities.

The First Semester Certificate may be completed in high school through the concurrent enrollment program, on campus as an undergraduate, or a combination of both. Once complete, the First Semester Certificate can be stacked with other courses to earn an Associate or a Bachelor degree.

GRADE REQUIREMENTS

Students must pass all Criminal Justice courses with a C- or better. It is also suggested that students take PSY 1010 or SOC 1010 to fulfill their social science requirement for future programs.

UNDERGRADUATE

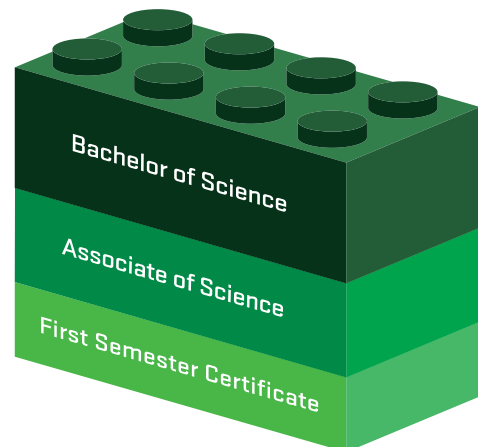

Certificate of Proficiency

Graduation Requirements:

1. Completion of a minimum of 15 Credits
2. Overall grade point average of 2.0 (C) or above.
3. Residency hours — minimum of 4 credit hours through course attendance at UVU.

*If long-range goal is AS or BS in CJ take additional classes to stay on track for a 4-year graduation plan.

Associate in Science

Graduation Requirements:

1. Completion of a minimum of 60 or more semester credits.
2. Overall grade point average of 2.0 (C) or above.
3. Residency hours — minimum of 20 credit hours through course attendance at UVU.
4. Completion of GE and specified departmental requirements.
5. Must have a grade of "C-" or higher in all core and elective requirements.

*If long-range goal is a BS in CJ take classes as outlined to stay on track for a 4-year graduation plan.

Bachelor in Science

Graduation Requirements:

1. Completion of a minimum of 120 or more semester credits with 40 semester credits from 3000 and 4000 level courses.
2. Overall grade point average of 2.0 (C) or above. Must have a grade of "C-" or higher in all core and elective requirements.
3. Residency hours — minimum of 30 credit hours through course attendance at UVU, with at least 10 hours earned in the last 45 hours.
4. Completion of GE and specified departmental requirements. Students are responsible for completing all prerequisite courses.
5. Successful completion of at least one Global or Intercultural Course.
