

First Semester Certificate

Graduation Requirements:

1. Completion of a minimum of 16 credits.
2. Overall grade point average of 2.0 (C) or above.
3. Residency hours — minimum of 4 credit hours through course attendance at UVU

If long-range goal is AS or AAS in CAW, take additional classes to stay on track for a 2-year graduation plan.

Certificate of Completion

Graduation Requirements:

1. Completion of a minimum of 32 semester credits.
2. Overall grade point average of 2.0 (C) or above.
3. Residency hours — minimum of 10 credit hours through course attendance at UVU.
4. Complete all courses with a minimum grade of “C-” or better.

If long-range goal is AAS or AS in CAW, take additional classes to stay on track for a 2-year graduation plan.

Associate of Applied Science

Graduation Requirements:

1. Completion of a minimum of 63 semester credits.
2. Overall grade point average of 2.0 (C) or above.
3. Residency hours — minimum of 20 credit hours through course attendance at UVU.
4. Completion of GE and specified departmental requirements

If long-range goal is BS in Construction Management or Tech Management, take classes as outlined to stay on track for a 4-year graduation plan.
