### Projects on the Environment

The newly created **Environmental Initiatives Hub** at the Center for Social Impact is pleased to announce funding available for **projects related to environmental issues**. This funding is part of the Civic Thought and Leadership Program grant made to UVU by the Utah Legislature, so preference will be given to research/projects that have potential policy implications for the State of Utah. All funds must be spent by July 1, 2022.

For this funding, environmental issues are defined broadly and projects from all disciplines are welcome. Projects can include traditional research projects, experiential learning activities for students, course material development, site visits, community-engaged learning projects, community workshops, and many other things. You are encouraged to think creatively, make connections across disciplines and with our communities, and to envision projects that can make a difference in our state. All projects must include students. **Funds of up to \$2500 are available**. Funds can be used for a wide variety of purposes, including (but not limited to) the following:

- Student wages
- Travel / conferences
- Faculty stipends
- Invited / community expert stipends
- Conference / workshop organization

If selected for funding, you will be required to participate in policy development training workshop during the Spring 2022 semester to learn more about the importance of and how to communicate your work to policy makers in the state.
