Student Advisement


- In ISS, we serve UVU's international students from arrival through alumni relations. We also act as the experts on ISS matters for UVU faculty, staff, and the greater Utah Valley community.
- Our main impact on students comes by way of one-on-one advisement on matters such as U.S. immigration, employment, scholarships, academic planning, and social adjustment.
- All ISS personnel are also Designated School Officials (DSO). Thus, we have a dual reporting line to UVU and to the U.S. federal government.


International Student Council Mentoring


- All international students at UVU have been assigned to an International Student Council (ISC) mentoring group. Each mentoring group is headed by two members of the ISC.
- The ISC Mentors are responsible for onboarding new students and mentoring existing students towards graduation. ISC Mentors make weekly contact with their mentees. Also, each group organizes several monthly activities for their mentoring group.

- 450 F-1 international students
- 70 countries represented

- Students who attended at least one ISC mentoring activity are 35% more likely to persist
