S-211. PORTABLE PUMPS AND WATER USE

Course Description

This course is designed to provide knowledge and skills related to portable water delivery systems. The focus is on portable pumps. It does not address water delivery for engines. Topics covered include portable water delivery systems, equipment, roles and responsibilities, system design, and hydraulics. There is also a field exercise in which students will apply what they learned in the classroom.

Objective

Upon successful completion of this course, students should be able to demonstrate the knowledge and skills to design, set up, operate, troubleshoot, and shut down portable water delivery systems.

Target Group

Personnel desiring to be qualified as a firefighter type 1 (FFT1) or incident commander type 5 (ICT5), or those wanting to learn more about portable pumps and water use.
