S-359. MEDICAL UNIT LEADER

Course Description

This course is designed to provide the skills and knowledge needed to perform in the role of a medical unit leader (MEDL). Topics include gathering information, organizing the medical unit, supervising the unit, evaluation, documentation, and demobilization.

Objectives

Upon successful completion of this course, students should be able to:

- Plan, staff, and manage a medical unit.
- Coordinate with other incident entities as necessary.
- Respond to medical emergencies and transport patients.
- Describe how to provide high quality patient care.

Target Group

Current certification as an emergency medical technician (EMT) or equivalent
