



COURSE DESCRIPTION

ICS-300 Refresher

Course Description

This course describes in detail the Incident Command System (ICS) organization and operations in supervisory roles on expanding or Type 3 incidents. Topics include ICS fundamentals review, incident/event assessment and agency guidance in establishing incident objectives, unified command, incident resource management, planning process, demobilization, transfer of command, and close-out.

This course was developed in conjunction with the US Fire Administration's H465 course and the Emergency Management Institute's G300 course. These courses are built on the same lesson objectives and content as the NWCG I-300 course and are interchangeable. They are all National Incident Management System (NIMS) compliant.

Objective

• By the course conclusion, students will be able to demonstrate through activities, the duties, responsibilities, and capabilities of an effective ICS in expanding incidents.

Target Group

The target audience for this course is individuals who may assume a supervisory role in expanding incidents. This includes Command and General Staff positions as well as Division/Group Supervisor and/or Unit Leader level positions that may be activated during an expanding incident that typically extends into multiple Operational Periods.

Course Prerequisites

The following prerequisites are mandatory for the ICS 300 Refresher Training Class: ICS-100, ICS-200, ICS 300, IS-700, and IS-800.
