### **S-219. IGNITIONS OPERATIONS**

#### **Course Description**

This is an entry-level course providing training in the functional roles and responsibilities connected with firing operations. The course covers planning, ignition procedures and techniques, and equipment applicable to wildland and prescribed fire. This course also addresses the role of the ignition specialist or firing boss as the organization manages escalation from a non-complex to a complex fire situation. Note: This course is not intended to qualify or certify personnel in the use, storage, or transport of any firing device. Rather, it is to provide the potential firing boss a description of available equipment and the requirements specific to each such device.

#### **Objectives**

By the end of this course, you will be able to:

- Identify the responsibilities of the Firing Boss, Single Resource ([FIRB](#)) for planning, implementing, and evaluating a firing operation on a wildland or prescribed fire.
- Given a wildland or prescribed fire scenario, choose the proper components of a Firing Plan to meet specific objectives.
- Implement a Firing Plan, adjusting as needed based on changing conditions.
- Determine the unique considerations for managing higher complexity firing operations.
