#### S-230. CREW BOSS

#### **Course Description**

This course is designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills to perform the duties of the Crew Boss (**CRWB**) position, as described in the NWCG Incident Position Standards for Crew Boss, PMS-350-98. Topics include travel and check-in in, briefings, assigning tasks and assessing crew performance, implementing fire line duties, mop-up, firing operations, using aerial resources, medical emergencies, and wildland urban interface.

#### **Objectives**

- Given a scenario and supporting materials, students will be able to:
- Demonstrate briefing of assigned resources.
- Evaluate, implement, and provide the rationale for the appropriate decisions to accomplish each of the following assignment objectives:
  - o Direct attack
  - o Firing operations
  - o Aerial resources
  - o Medical emergency
  - o Wildland-urban interface

- o Mop-up
- Identify the resource needs and tactical adjustments for the assignment objectives.

### **Target Group**

Personnel desiring to be qualified as **Crew Boss, Single Resource**.

## **Course Prerequisites**

- Qualified as a firefighter type 1 (FFT1)
- Successful completion of Intermediate Wildland Fire Behavior (S-290)
- Satisfactory completion of pre-course work
