- The Mountain Agenda is Kyrgyzstan's framework for promoting sustainable mountain development at both national and global levels.






Essence and Strategic Importance


It aims to:

- Protect fragile mountain ecosystems;
- Improve livelihoods and resilience of mountain communities;
- Secure global recognition for mountain countries' special needs.





Charting The Vision



1. Environment & Climate

Climate adaptation, glacier preservation, sustainable water management, green technologies.



02. Economy & Trade

Support for mountain agriculture, organic farming, green value chains, and ecotourism.

03. Social Development

Strengthening infrastructure, education, healthcare, and gender-responsive employment.



04. Culture & Heritage

Preservation of traditional mountain lifestyles, crafts, and cultural landscapes.

05. Regional Cooperation

Advancing regional initiatives such as the Central Asian Mountain Charter and global partnerships (Mountain Partnership, UNEP, UNDP, FAO).

Kyrgyzstan will host the Third Global Mountain Summit (Bishkek Summit).






Integration with National and Regional Strategies


Embedded in Kyrgyzstan's sustainable and climate policy frameworks:


