Special Needs Kids Need Your Help



Unique purpose! Awesome project! Unique timing!

Global Grant for Special Needs Children in Montenegro

Unique Purpose: To show Humanitarian Services of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints the power of partnering with Rotary, so they contribute to Endowment-SHARE.

Awesome Project: Our Utah Rotary District is partnering with eight Montenegro Rotary clubs, which are partnering with the Montenegrin Ministry of Education, and hopefully LDS Humanitarian Services, to accomplish two successive Global Grants (GGs) serving special needs children in Montenegro, a country in the Balkans.

Unique Timing: We are advised by our Zone leaders to submit GGs by the end of February, not during March, April, May or June. Why?

Five years ago, Rotary established a “Use your District Designated Funds (DDF) or Lose Them” policy starting this June 30. We will lose no DDF, but many, many districts will be cramming in GGs to beat the June 30 deadline. Rotary Grants Officers will be overwhelmed. We are told to submit early to get our GG approved.

PLEASE HELP!

Please, individuals and clubs, let’s commit as much as possible in the next 25 days, so this Montenegro Global Grant application can be submitted by the end of February! Please tell Jerry Summerhays of your commitments, SummerhaysGS@gmail.com.

The Montenegrin Rotary Clubs have raised \$100,000 cash for the project!!

The Ministry of Education asks them to do the project, and will sustain the teaching and the equipment. The grant writer, Milijana Vukotic, President of **Rotary Club Budva in Montenegro**, writes,

“This Global Grant project aims to improve access to inclusive education for children with special educational needs in Montenegro through the introduction of assistive technologies and structured teacher training. The project will provide assistive devices:

- tablets,
- specialized keyboards and mice,
- Braille printing technology,
- screen-reading software with symbol-based communication boards,
- and equipment for children with physical disabilities.

In parallel, teachers and professional staff will receive hands-on training to ensure the effective and sustainable use of this technology in daily classroom practice."

You don't have to be a millionaire - or even an itemizer - to make a meaningful, world-changing gift.
