I have six women and leadership announcements for November:

First, the [Call for Proposals](http://www.ila-net.org/WLC/WLC19-2/index.html) for the International Leadership Association's 2019 Women and Leadership Conference will be closing on November 15th. The conference will be held from 16-19 June 2019 at the beautiful 1440 Multiversity, nestled in the redwoods near Santa Cruz, California, USA. The conference theme is "Women in Leadership: Building Solutions, Harmony, and the Greater Good." Learn more there about the conference, the venue, and answer the call for reviewers. Second, the 7th and final book in the International Leadership Association's [Women and Leadership Series](#) has now been published (Series Editors: Susan Madsen, Karen Longman, and Faith Ngunjiri). *More Women on Boards: An International Perspective*, edited by Lynne Devnew, Marlene Janzen Le Ber, Mariateresa Torchia, and Ronald Burke, includes the work of 42 researchers, practitioners, and activists from at least 17 countries on six continents addressing the questions: Why have women on boards? Why is adding women to boards so challenging? What actions increase the number of women on boards? And What can we learn from situations where there are women board members? Third, a Call for Papers is now open (until Nov. 15th, even though the call says Oct. 31) for a special issue of the Journal of East European Management Studies titled, "Women in Management in Central and Eastern European Countries." Abstracts up to 1500 words need to be submitted by the deadline. Guest editors include Irma Rybnikova, Anna Soulsby, and Susanne Blazejewski. More details can be found at [this link](#).

Fourth, there is also a Call for Chapters now open for the Edward Elgar Research Handbook of Women's Entrepreneurship and Value Creation. The editors are seeking chapter contributions (6000 words) *based on rich narratives* reflecting different perspectives on value creation across a range of international economic contexts, cultures, or industry sectors. Chapters particularly are sought from researchers in geographic regions not currently or sufficiently represented in the women entrepreneurship literature, specifically Africa, Asia, and South America. The submission deadline for chapter proposals is the 1st of November (they have some flexibility with the deadline, so email Dr. Shumaila Yousafzai (YousafzaiS@cardiff.ac.uk) for further details).

Fifth, the Call for Papers is also open for the 2nd International Interdisciplinary Conference on Gender, Work and Society. The theme is "Gender, work and leadership: Bringing together feminist and postcolonial insights," The deadline for submissions is 15 December 2018, and the conference will be held at LUMS, Lahore from 27-28 April 2019.
