#### Mia Love, Congresswoman, 4th District, U.S. House of Representatives

Representative Mia Love was born in Brooklyn, New York and raised by hard-working parents. She graduated from the University of Hartford, then moved to Utah and married her husband, Jason Love. Eager to begin fulfilling her father's ethic of "giving back," Rep. Love launched a career in the public sector by serving two terms on the city council of Saratoga Springs, where she later served as mayor from 2010-2014. In 2014 she was elected to the U. S. House of Representatives. Known for her conservative positions on limited government, Rep. Love is the recipient of numerous civic and government awards. She and her husband have three children.

#### Neill F. Marriott, Second Counselor, Young Women General Presidency, LDS Church

Neill Marriott grew up in a Methodist home in Louisiana, earned a degree at Southern Methodist University, and later worked as a secretary at Harvard. While there, she joined The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and dedicated her life to serving others, especially her husband, 11 children, and 34 grandchildren. Her current Church assignment is in worldwide service to young women, age 12-18, where she has met young women and leaders in Jamaica, Dominican Republic, Hong Kong, Mongolia, Cambodia, South Africa, and Brazil as well as in the U.S. She hopes to inspire young women to stand up for themselves, get a good education, and find purpose in contributing to their homes and communities through unselfish service.

#### Mary Nickles, News Anchor, Channel 2, KUTV

Mary Nickles, an Emmy-award winning journalist, joined KUTV News in 1991, and she currently co-anchors weekdays on 2NEWS This Morning and 2NEWS at Noon. Mary grew up in Washington and majored in English at Lewis-Clark State College. She is very active in our community, serving on numerous boards and with local non-profits. As part of her reporting on health issues, Mary got a mammogram to encourage more women to get screened, and in turn found an invasive, malignant tumor.
