Sexual assault is a serious concern in Utah and the nation.



Sexual assault includes

unwanted touching


being forced to take sexual pictures

Rape is sexual assault with vaginal/anal penetration.

HOW DOES UTAH STACK UP?

Rape is the only violent crime where Utah's rate is above the national average.



Otah has the

9th highest
rape per capita rate
in the nation.

SEXUAL ASSAULT VULNERABILITIES

Forensic examination data helps us understand personal and situational vulnerabilities of victims.

Victim Vulnerabilities

27.6 average age 94.7% women

47.2% self-disclosed mental illness

22.4% reported no permanent address

9.6% reported physical/mental impairment

Situational Vulnerabilities

62.6% of assaults take place in a house/apartment

40.7% involve alcohol use by the victim

16.2% are suspected drug-facilitated sexual assaults

16.1% involve drug use by the victim

12.6% of victims are asleep and awakened to assault

Compared to Utah census data, Black and Native American individuals are disproportionately affected by sexual assault.

PSYCHOLOGICAL & PHYSICAL IMPACT

Victims experience significant harm due to sexual assault.

Victims report being



High levels of fear can incapacitate victims during the assault.

The financial burden of rape is estimated to cost \$1,700 per Utah resident per year.



71% report non-anogential injuries (e.g., bruises to extremities) 48.6% report loss of consciousness

47.7% report anogential injuries (e.g., lacerations)



SEXUAL ASSAULT KITS & PROSECUTION

Decade long efforts are improving processing of sexual assault kits.





of adult sexual assault cases are referred by law enforcement for prosecution.



of cases are actually prosecuted.

National and state funding allowed state officials to test over 11,000 backlogged sexual assault kits and log over 5,000 forensic DNA profiles into national databases.
