# What is Web Accessibility?

**Web accessibility** refers to the inclusive practice of removing barriers that prevent interaction with, or access to websites, by people with disabilities. When sites are correctly designed, developed and edited, all users have equal access to information and functionality.

# What Are The Requirements?

Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.0 defines how to make Web content more accessible to people with disabilities. Accessibility involves a wide range of disabilities, including visual, auditory, physical, speech, cognitive, language, learning, and neurological disabilities.

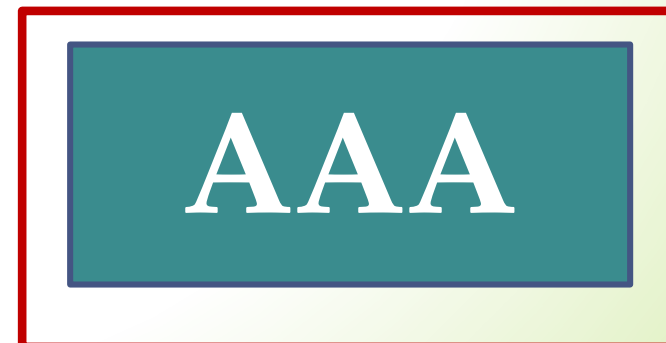
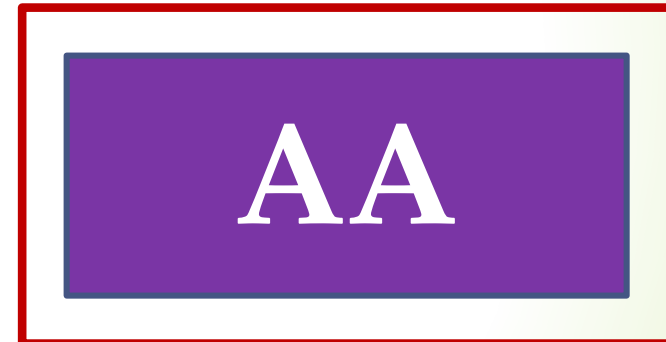


# WCAG2.0 Levels

## Web Content MUST BE:

- Perceivable
- Operable
- Understandable
- Robust

# How Do We Make Our Sites Accessible?

- Realize this will not happen overnight
- Have a plan with deadlines
- Draft policies, procedures, and instructions
- Enlist everyone's help
- Continue with making all content accessible





# So, What Can We Do Now?

- ❑ Use Final Check on every page (correct accessibility errors)
- ❑ Links need unique and descriptive names
- ❑ Use proper alt text for images
- ❑ Use headings correctly (h1, h2, h3, h4, h5, h6)
- ❑ Use color with care
- ❑ Design forms for accessibility
- ❑ Use tables for tabular data, not layout
- ❑ Ensure all content is keyboard accessible
- ❑ Caption all videos
- ❑ Make all PDFs accessible
