## AFFIDAVIT OF SUPPORT

## Utah Valley University MAcc Program

- The University will issue an I-20 Certificate of Eligibility for a student to obtain his/her student visa. However, before the University can issue the I-20, the student must provide proof of financial responsibility.
- With this statement of support, student sponsor assumes financial support.

## In addition to this form, sponsors must also provide a financial statement to the International Admissions Office showing sufficient funds to cover the support listed below.

Currently, estimated costs for living expenses, tuition, and fees are:

- \$55,000 for MAcc students (12 credits for 2 semesters and 6 credit for 1 semester, out-of-state tuition and fees, plus living expenses)\*
- \$2,000 for each dependent accompanying the F-1 student\*

NOTE: The MAcc Office has a limited number of Non-Resident Tuition Scholarships available on an annual basis. This scholarship is awarded after the student is admitted to the program. Scholarships are merit based and awarded on a first applied, first admitted basis. (See Option 2 below.)
